About the 360 Report

The 360 Report is published quarterly to provide CYFD management, staff, and external partners with data on:

- Reports of child abuse and neglect
- Investigations of child abuse and neglect
- Substantiated cases
- · Permanency plans for youth in custody
- Plans for reunifications
- Number of youth in foster care

These data can be used to inform New Mexicans of trends in a particular area and where support may be needed. Data can also indicate positive outcomes in an aspect of the system in a particular county or region. The 360 Report is a tool that can brings science to inform the prevention and treatment process.

About the Data

Data for the County Profiles is prepared through the collaborative efforts of the Data Evaluation Unit and FACTS Unit within the Research, Assessment, and Data Bureau and Information Technology Services, with the assistance and guidance of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration For Children and Families, Administration on Children, Youth and Families, Children's Bureau.

About Protective Services

Protective Services strives to enhance the safety, permanency and well-being of children and families in New Mexico.

Protective Services workers investigate reports of child maltreatment and intervene to keep New Mexico's children safe. We provide foster care to approximately 2,500 children each day and work with families to enable parents to safely care for their children. When that cannot be accomplished, Protective Services workers find safe, permanent families for children through adoption or permanent guardianship.

Protective Services also works with youth emancipating from the foster care system to assist them in successfully transitioning into adulthood.








Race of Children in Care: This chart illustrates the distribution of race for the children in CYFD care statewide.


Hispanic Children in New Mexico in Care: This chart illustrates the percentage of Hispanic and non-Hispanic children in care statewide.













Children Who Were Discharged To Reunify-Percent Who Re-enter Care In Less Than 12 Months









Percent of Abuse & Neglect Petitions Filed Statewide by Region 18 Months Ending 03/31/2014 N = 1,781




Average Months from The first "Adjudication Disposition Completed" to The First "Permanency Completed"
















Race of Children in Care: This chart illustrates the distribution of races for the children in CYFD care statewide.


Hispanic Children in New Mexico in Care: This chart illustrates the percentage of Hispanic and non-Hispanic children in care statewide.




























Race of Children in Care: This chart illustrates the distribution of races for the children in CYFD care statewide.


Hispanic Children in New Mexico in Care: This chart illustrates the percentage of Hispanic and non-Hispanic children in care statewide.

















































































Race of Children in Care: This chart illustrates the distribution of races for the children in CYFD care statewide.




























































Race of Children in Care: This chart illustrates the distribution of races for the children in CYFD care statewide.
























































