Protective Services workers investigate reparts of child maltreatment and intervene ta keep New Mexico's children safe. We provide foster care to appraximately 2,500 children each day and work with families to enable parents to safely care for their children. When that cannat be accomplished, Protective Services finds safe, permanent families for children through adoption or permanent guardianship.
Protective Services alsa works with youth emancipating from the foster care system to help them successfully transition into adulthood.
