
360 DEGREES COUNTY PROFILES 3RD QUARTER SFY 2009 (JANUARY 1, 2009 - MARCH 31, 2009)








Adoption Update

According to the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), since 1999, there have been at least 125,000 children in public care each year waiting to be adopted. This presents a great challenge for adoptive children and those working to find them permanent homes. Public welfare agencies are responding to this challenge, and since 1995 there has been an overall national rise in the number of adoptions of children that have public welfare agency involvement. Comparing federal fiscal year (FFY) 1995 to FFY 2006 there was a 98% increase in the number of such adoptions on a national level. New Mexico adoptions have also followed this upward trend. A comparison between FFY 1995 and FFY 2006 shows that New Mexico had a 140% increase in the number adoptions of children that were in the custody of the state. According to the most recent data from ACF, adoptions of children involved with a public welfare agency have fluctuated on a national level in recent years; whereas the New Mexico Child Welfare System has seen a consistent increase in the number of children adopted since 2003, as depicted in Chart 1 below.



Data developed by the Children, Youth & Families Department (CYFD) for state fiscal years (SFY) for the child welfare adoption system, reflects this trend. Although the numbers in Chart 2 below may differ slightly from federal figures due to differences in sources and reporting periods, a continuing increase in the number of adoptions in New Mexico is clear.



The numbers of adoptions for New Mexico are increasing; however, there are still many children waiting to be adopted. During the 1st quarter of the 2009 state fiscal year (quarter ending September 30, 2008), 1003 children had "adoption as a permanency goal" and 538 children were legally freed and waiting to be adopted. During this same quarter, 106 children were adopted in New Mexico, accounting for approximately 20% of children freed and waiting during that time period. This puts New Mexico on pace to exceed the SFY 2009 number of adoptions (491). One of the continuing challenges for the child welfare adoption program is that the number of children adopted during the entire SFY 2008 accounts for fewer than half of children in the custody of CYFD with adoption as a permanency goal during just the last quarter.


Adoption is an outcome that yields benefits for all involved. Nevertheless children adopted through the child welfare system can have unique needs. CYFD or other entities provide services, depending on the needs of the new family. Such services and resources include but are not limited to adoption subsidies, mental health care, and support groups. CYFD is dedicated to supporting adoptive families with a goal of creating permanent placements for adopted children. Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Cibola County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care

(Yes or No), in care 8 days or more. Source: AFCARS rolling 12 months for period ending 03/31/09








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal McKinley County







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Juan County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sandoval County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Torrance County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Valencia County








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Colfax County







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Guadalupe County





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Los Alamos County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Mora County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Rio Arriba County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Santa Fe County





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal **Taos County**





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Union County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal **Bernalillo County**






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Bernalillo County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Chaves County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Curry County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal De Baca County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Eddy County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Harding County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lea County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Quay County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Roosevelt County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Catron County





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Dona Ana County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Grant County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Hidalgo County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lincoln County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Luna County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Otero County





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sierra County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Socorro County



In New Mexico 27.5% if Children in Care had Incarcerated Parent as a Condition of Removal 12 months ending 3/31/09


