





Homelessness


Did you know that according to the Annual Homelessness Assessment Report to Congress (2007) nearly one-fourth of all sheltered homeless persons in the United States are age 17 or younger? According to the same report as many as one-third of all unsheltered homeless persons in the United States are persons in families. Homelessness has a profound and lasting effect on children and families. Evidence shows that children who are victims of homelessness are at risk for health problems, poor nutrition, developmental delays, psychological problems, educational underachievement, and other risks to their general well being (Rafferty & Shinn, 1991). This issue is of particular importance to child welfare agencies as research has shown that a high prevalence of family homelessness has been found among children in foster care (Zlotnick, Kronstadt, & Klee, 1998).

According to a 2005 count by the New Mexico Coalition to End Homelessness, there are approximately 17,000 residents of New Mexico who experience homelessness each year. New Mexico does not fare well on homelessness in a national context. A report released in by the National Center on Family Homelessness (2009) evaluated states based on extent of child homelessness, child well-being, risk for child homelessness, and state policy and planning efforts. In this report New Mexico ranked 47th (1st=best) in the nation in child homelessness.

A lack of adequate housing impacts the number of children placed with the New Mexico child welfare system.

Although CYFD Protective Services does not measure children taken into custody as a result of homelessness per

se, "inadequate housing" is accounted for as a condition associated with removal. Inadequate housing is defined as facilities that are unsafe or inadequate for a child to reside in and includes cases of homelessness. Of the children that had a current or new placement with Protective Services in calendar year 2008, approximately one quarter (23.8%) had inadequate housing as a condition associated with removal from their caregivers and placement in the child welfare system. Studies have found that factors such as inadequate housing can have a detrimental effect on successful reunification (Jones, 1998).



Homelessness and inadequate housing is

not only a challenge causing the entry of children into state care; it is also a challenge for youth transitioning out of state care. One hundred sixteen children 'aged out' of the child welfare agency in the 2009 state fiscal year, which does not include all children transitioning out of care in the CYFD Juvenile Justice agency. Many of these children need support beyond what relatives or friends can provide. To address this issue of inadequate community support, CYFD had developed resources for youth via transitional living programs. In New Mexico, through the *Transitions* program, multiple agencies are collaborating to assure youth exiting to emancipation or aging out of foster care at age 18 years have adequate housing.

Transitions is a supportive housing program that is based in Albuquerque. It is based on the Housing First model and assists up to 10 youth aging out of foster care (ages 18 – 21) that have significant behavioral health needs. These youth are provided with housing vouchers, very similar to Section 8 housing. Youth pay up to 30% of their income as a contribution to support their housing needs. There are also 10 vouchers for youth who have been released from juvenile justice facilities with similar needs for supports. This program is funded through New Mexico general funds and federal Chaffee funds. There is a partnership among CYFD, the New Mexico Behavioral Health Collaborative, the Supportive Housing Coalition of New Mexico and the Optum Health – State Single Entity. Although coverage is not yet statewide, progress is being made to provide an array of services and resources to these youth.

In addition to the resources directly offered through CYFD additional resources for the homeless in New Mexico are available. For example the Supportive Housing Coalition of New Mexico is a non profit organization with more than 350 housing units aimed at the homeless, particularly those with behavioral health problems. The homeless are also served by the New Mexico Coalition to End Homelessness.

In New Mexico, advocates for youth housing and services have been working to acquire sustained revenues to support needed services for youth exiting the child welfare system. In the 2008 New Mexico legislative session SB 128 was introduced. This bill was entitled "Foster Youth Transitional Support." The bill asked for almost \$1.7 million in contracts for transitional living services and housing. Further, \$750,000 was requested for the provision of supportive housing for youth in transition and \$650,000 was requested for recruitment, training and provision of specialized foster homes for older youth to support the intensive needs of certain youth in transition from foster care. Unfortunately, New Mexico was unable to pass this bill during the 2008 session and no similar bill was introduced in the 2009 session.

Strides are being made to promote the alleviation and prevention of Homelessness in New Mexico at the state level. For Example in April of 2009 Gov. Bill Richardson announced that New Mexico would be the recipient of \$8.6 million dollars in funding specifically targeted at combating homelessness in the state. Continuing progress should help to improve homelessness in the state and subsequently limit the number of children and families who experience homelessness in New Mexico.





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Cibola County













Percent of Substantiated Allegations In Cibola SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 145





Age of Child Victims in Cibola SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009

Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal McKinley County





Percent of Substantiated Allegations in McKinley SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 283



Age of Child Victims in McKinley SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Juan County








Percent of Substantiated Allegations in San Juan SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 452






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sandoval County






Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Sandoval SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 259







Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Torrance SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 142



Age of Child Victims in Torrance SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Valencia County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Valencia SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 705



Age of Child Victims in Valencia SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Colfax County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Colfax SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 73



Age of Child Victims in Colfax SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Guadalupe County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Guadalupe SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 30





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Los Alamos County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Los Alamos SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 30



Age of Child Victims in Los Alamos SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Mora County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Mora SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 6



Age of Child Victims in Mora SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Rio Arriba County






Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Rio Arriba SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 274


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Miguel County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in San Miguel SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 219



Age of Child Victims in San Miguel SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Santa Fe County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Santa Fe SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 262



Age of Child Victims in Santa Fe SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Taos County








Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Taos SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 88




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Union County









Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Bernalillo County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Bernalillo East SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 1.085



Age of Child Victims in Bernalillo East







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Bernalillo County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Bernalillo West SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 728



Age of Child Victims in Bermalillo West SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Chaves County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Chaves SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 503



Age of Child Victims in Chaves SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Curry County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Curry SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 432



Age of Child Victims in Curry SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal De Baca County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in De Baca SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 13



Age of Child Victims in De Baca SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Eddy County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Eddy SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 322



Age of Child Victims in Eddy SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Harding County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lea County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Lea SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 408



Age of Child Victims in Lea SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Quay County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Quay SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 163



Age of Child Victims in Quay SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Roosevelt County








Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Roosevelt SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 108







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Catron County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Catron SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009



Age of Child Victims in Catron SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Dona Ana County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Dona Ana SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 984



Age of Child Victims in Dona Ana SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Grant County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Grant SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 121




Age of Child Victims in Grant SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Hidalgo County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Hidalgo SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 31



Age of Child Victims in Hidalgo SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lincoln County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Lincoln SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 46





Age of Child Victims in Lincoln SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Luna County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Luna SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 159



Age of Child Victims in Luna SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Otero County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Otero SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 239



Age of Child Victims in Otero SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sierra County













Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Sierra SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 40



Age of Child Victims in Sierra SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Socorro County











Percent of Substantiated Allegations in Socorro SFY 09 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 47



Age of Child Victims in Socorro SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009










Percent of Substantiated Allegations In New Mexico SFY 2009 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 N = 8,430
