


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 09/30/2012




Northwest Region

total children under 20, McKinley County had 3.3% of NM Protective Service's total children "in care" as of September 30, 2012, which is less than expected, based on population alone.


Hispanic Children in McKinley




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%










Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Age of Children In Care - Point-in-Time






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 09/30/2012



Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013









Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013










Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Bernalillo County







Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 09/30/2012








Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Hispanic Children in Eddy




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time September 30, 2012 Roosevelt County N = 21







Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 09/30/2012



Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013




Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures




Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2013




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




