Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Cibola County





Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal McKinley County














Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 San Juan County N = 46






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Juan County












Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care


Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System


Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Torrance County N = 10



Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Torrance County





Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Valencia County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Children in an Out of Home Placement for More than Ten Days with an Initial EPSDT Examination ¹






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Guadalupe County N = 9






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Guadalupe County








Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Los Alamos County







Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 1 SFY 2011








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Mora County







Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 2 SFY 2011






Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Rio Arriba County

Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%






Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Miguel County










Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Santa Fe County N = 10






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Santa Fe County





Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 2 SFY 2011








Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Union County N = 11




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010







Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010














Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Chaves County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal








Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal De Baca County








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Eddy County












Percent of Childrenin Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Harding County





Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures




Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lea County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Quay County








Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Roosevelt County N = 12






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Roosevelt County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%






Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Catron County N = 0






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Catron County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Dona Ana County








Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Grant County





Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Hidalgo County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 12/31/2010


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lincoln County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care






Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Luna County N = 24




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Luna County










Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Otero County N = 30



Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Otero County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time December 31, 2010 Sierra County N = 9




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sierra County





Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 2 SFY 2011







Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Socorro County







Percent of Substantiated Allegations in New Mexico Qtr 2 SFY 11 October - December 2010 N = 2,085






Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 2 SFY 2011 N = 2,256








