




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Cibola County N = 23




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Cibola County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal McKinley County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Juan County


Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care








Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Torrance County N = 3






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal **Torrance County**








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Valencia County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Guadalupe County





Trends of Absence of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 94.6%




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Los Alamos County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%



Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2011








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Mora County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Rio Arriba County


Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal San Miguel County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Santa Fe County






Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%

Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2011










CPS Investigations in Bernaillo East Qtr 3 SFY 11 January -March 2011 N = 584






Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Chaves County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%







Children Living below the Poverty Level as a % of all Children in the County:²




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal De Baca County








Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Eddy County








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Harding County




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Lea County N = 48




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal






Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Quay County N = 13






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Quay County






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal **Roosevelt County**




Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Catron County


Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2011




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Dona Ana County N = 61




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Dona Ana County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2011


Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Grant County




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Hidden County N = 2






Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal **Hidalgo County**






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2011




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2011 Lincoln County N = 4




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Lincoln County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care



Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Luna County








Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care








Age of Children In Care - Point-in-Time





Children in an Out of Home Placement for More than Ten Days with an Initial EPSDT Examination ¹ Quarter 3 SFY 2011 January - March 2011




Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Sierra County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2011

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2011








Percent of Children in Care with Incarcerated Parents as a Condition of Removal Socorro County






Trends of Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 99.68%







Percent of Substantiated Allegations in New Mexico Qtr 3 SFY 11 January - March 2011 N=1,362




Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2011 N = 2,278







Abuse and Neglect Petitions Filed


