Protective Services strives to enhance the safety, permanency and well-being of children and families in New Mexico.

Protective Services workers investigate reports of child maltreatment and intervene to keep New Mexico's children safe. We provide foster care to approximately 2,500 children each day and work with families to enable parents to safely care for their children. When that cannot be accomplished, Protective Services workers find safe, permanent families for children through adoption or permanent guardianship.

Protective Services also works with youth emancipating from the foster care system to assist them in successfully transitioning into adulthood.

About the 360 Report

The 360 Report is published quarterly to provide CYFD management, staff, and external partners with data on:

- Reports of child abuse and neglect
- · Investigations of child abuse and neglect
- Substantiated cases
- Permanency plans for youth in custody
- Plans for reunifications
- Number of youth in foster care

These data can be used to inform New Mexicans of trends in a particular area and where support may be needed. Data can also indicate positive outcomes in an aspect of the system in a particular county or region. The 360 Report is a tool that can brings science to inform the prevention and treatment process.



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


About Children in Care


There are 579,841 children in New Mexico under the age of 20, (from the 2010 U. S. Census). This represents 0.7 % of the Nation's total children under 19.

From fiscal year 2013 Q2 to Q3 the number of children in care increased in New Mexico by approximately 1.4 percent. The distribution of the children by race and ethnicity didn't vary greatly from one quarter to the next. However, there were some noticeable changes in age ranges. From the second to the third quarter the percentage of children in the 6 to 10 and 11 to 15 year range dropped by 10 and 12.7 percent respectively. On the other hand, children in the 16 to 17 year range increased by 23.1 percent.




About Permanency

Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2013 N = 2,153





About Reports and Investigations

The number of accepted reports of abuse and neglect increased by 12.4 percent (or 546) from the second to the third quarter of fiscal year 2013. During the same time period the number of substantiated investigations increased by 5.4 percent (or 59).


About Adoption

During the third quarter of SFY 2013, 589 Children had "adoption" as a permanency goal. As of March 31, 2013, 329 children were legally freed to be adopted. Of those legally freed, 78 were in adoptive family homes and had an adoptive agreement signed and in effect.

About Recruitment

During the 3rd quarter of SFY 2013, 193 applications were received back from ap-

plicant inquiries and 411 applications were mailed out, as a part of recruitment program efforts.



Adoption and Foster Care Recruitment Qtr 3 SFY 2013 January—March 2013






Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) Permanency Measures


Children who grow up in safe, stable and permanent homes are more likely to maximize their potential and become productive and contributing members of society. They are less likely to have future justice system contact, substance abuse, mental health issues and homelessness. All children should have the opportunity for permanency and stability in their living situations.



Strategic Planning Measures: Of all children in foster care for 8 days or longer who were discharged to reunification in the target 12 month period above, the data indicates that 66.7% were reunified in less than 12 months from the date of the latest removal from home.



Strategic Planning Measures: Of all children who were discharged from foster care to a finalized adoption during the target 12 month period listed above, the data indicates that 30.6 % were discharged in less than 24 months from the date of the latest



Strategic Planning Measures: Of all children in foster care for 8 days or longer who were discharged to reunification in the 12 month period prior to the target 12 month period listed above, the data indicate that 8.7 percent re-entered foster care in less than 12 months from the date of discharge?



About Legal Cases

The legal case statistics extract is run with data from the previous 18 months. The report selects all case participants who have a legal status record of "Abuse and Neglect Petition" filed in the parameter period.

It is important for every person to take child abuse and neglect seriously and to be able to recognize when it happens. Abuse and neglect may be physical, sexual or emotional.

Physical abuse includes:

- Cases in which a child exhibits evidence of a skin bruising, bleeding, malnutrition, failure to thrive, burns, fracture of a bone, subdural hematoma, tissue swelling or death, and
- 2. There is not a justifiable explanation for the condition or death.

Sexual abuse includes:


- 1. Criminal sexual contact
- 2. Incest or criminal sexual penetration
- Sexual exploitation (acts such as allowing, permitting or encouraging a child to engage in prostitution or obscene or pornographic photographing, or filming a child for obscene or pornographic commercial purposes)

Neglect includes:


- 1. The abandonment of a child by a parent, guardian or custodian.
- 2. The failure of a parent, guardian or custodian to provide a child with proper parental care and control or subsistence, education, medical or other care or control necessary for the child's well being.
- When a child is physically or sexually abused and the child's parent, guardian or custodian knew or should have known of the abuse and failed to take reasonable steps to protect the child from further harm.

4. Parental inability to discharge their responsibilities to and for the child because of parental incarceration, hospitalization, or physical or mental disorder or incapacity.


Abuse and Neglect Petitions Filed 18 months Ending 03/31/2013 N = 1,578





Percent of Abuse & Neglect Petitions Filed Statewide by Region 18 Months Ending 03/31/2013 N = 1,578

Cibola County had 2.1% of NM Protective Service's total children "in care" as of December 31, 2012, which is more than expected, based on population alone.







CPS Investigations in Cibola Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 43










Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2013




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2013 Cibola County N = 11














PS Reports of Abuse and Neglect in New Mexico Accepted 59.2% Not Accepted 40.8%








Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2013




Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2013 McKinley County N = 21






National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) Safety Measures

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%

Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013










Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2013







Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%



CPS Reports of Abuse and Neglect in Sandoval Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 394












Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody Qtr 3 SFY 2013







CPS Investigations in Torrance Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 57





Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013







CPS Reports of Abuse and Neglect in Valencia Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 293







Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%





CPS Investigations in Colfax Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 59






Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%


CPS Investigations in Guadalupe Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 4








Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%


Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%










Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%










Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%




CPS Investigations in Taos Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 48








Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%








Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%








Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%








Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2013

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%









Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%

CPS Reports of Abuse and Neglect in Roosevelt Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 67






Children in Care with A Goal of Reunification Point In Time March 31, 2013 Roosevelt County N = 10












Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%










PS Investigations in Dona Ana Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 530






Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013






Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%














Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%




Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%


Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013

CPS Reports of Abuse and Neglect in Otero Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 263






Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013






Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%






Percent of Children With 2 or Fewer Placements For Period Ending 03/31/2013


PS Investigations in Socorro Qtr 3 SFY 13 January - March 2013 N = 56






Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%
