Protective Services workers investigate reports of child maltreatment and intervene to keep New Mexico's children safe. We provide foster care to approximately 2,500 children each day and work with families to enable parents to safely care for their children. When that cannot be accomplished, Protective Services workers find safe, permanent families for children through adoption or permanent guardianship.

Protective Services also works with youth emancipating from the foster care system to assist them in successfully transitioning into adulthood.

The 360 Report is published quarterly to provide CYFD management, staff, and external partners with data on:

- Reports of child abuse and neglect
- Investigations of child abuse and neglect
- Substantiated cases
- Permanency plans for youth in custody
- Plans for reunifications
- Number of youth in foster care

These data can be used to inform New Mexicans of trends in a particular area and where support may be needed. Data can also indicate positive outcomes in an aspect of the system in a particular county or region. The 360 Report is a tool that can bring science to inform the prevention and treatment process.

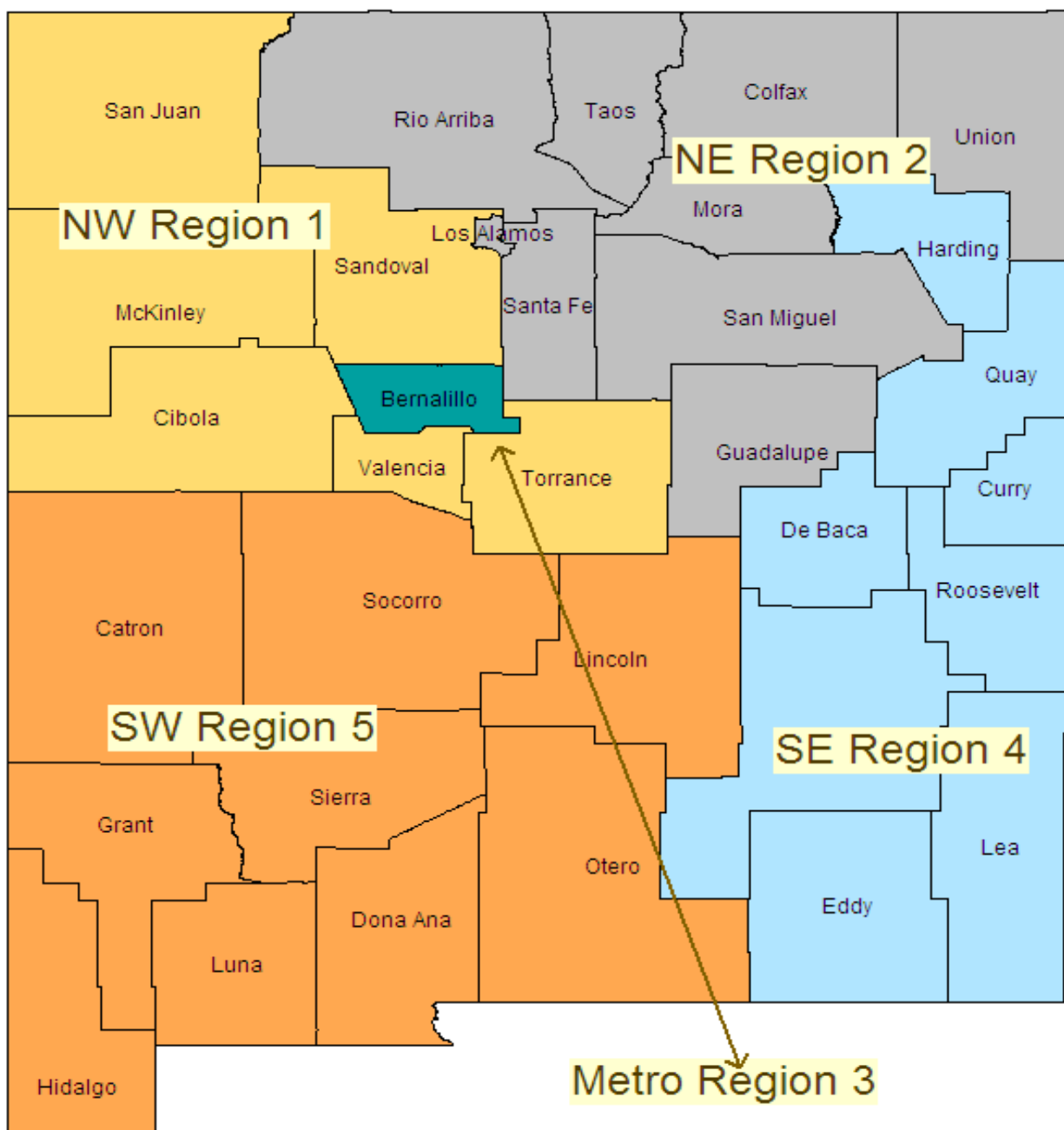

There are 579,841 children in New Mexico under the age of 20, (from the 2010 U. S. Census). This represents 0.7 % of the Nation's total children under 19.

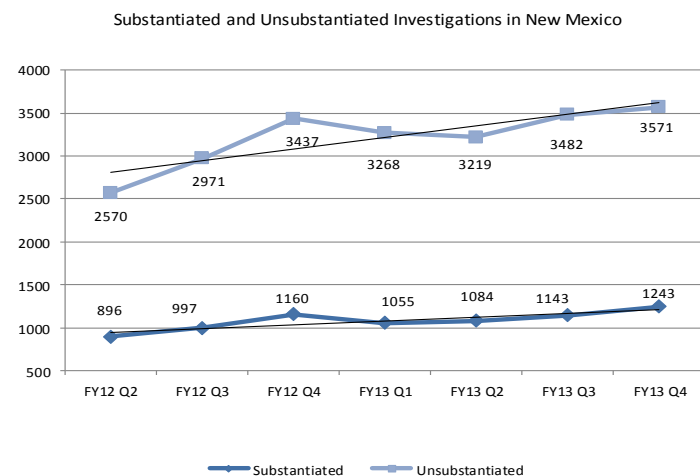
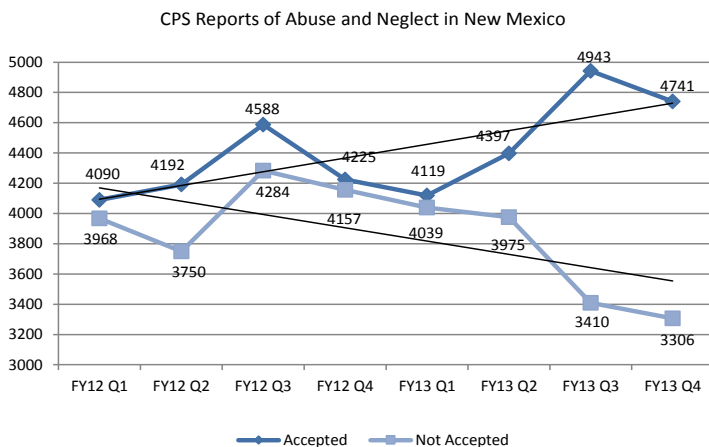


Figure1. Race of Children In Care 6/30/13

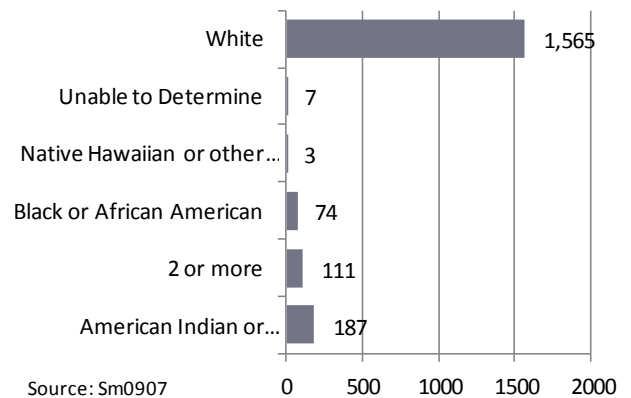


Figure2. Hispanic Children in New Mexico

Total Children in Care = 1,947

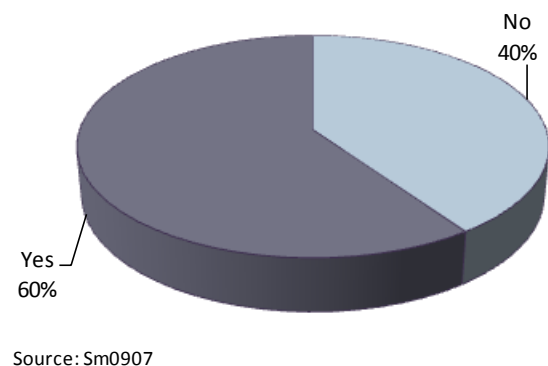


Figure3. Age of Children In Care - Point-in-Time

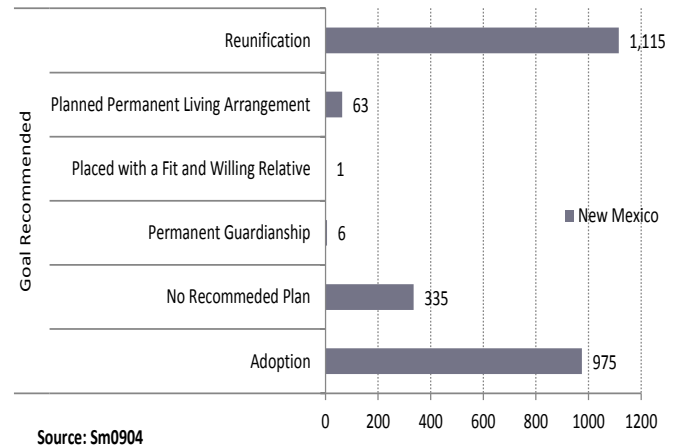

About Permanency

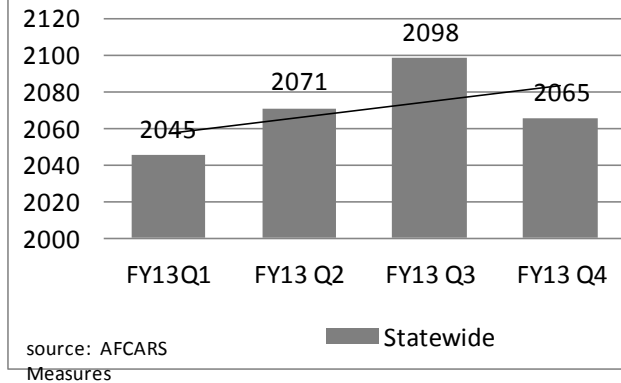
From the third to the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2013 the number of permanency plan goals increased by approximately 15.9 percent. The on-

Care License by Quarter

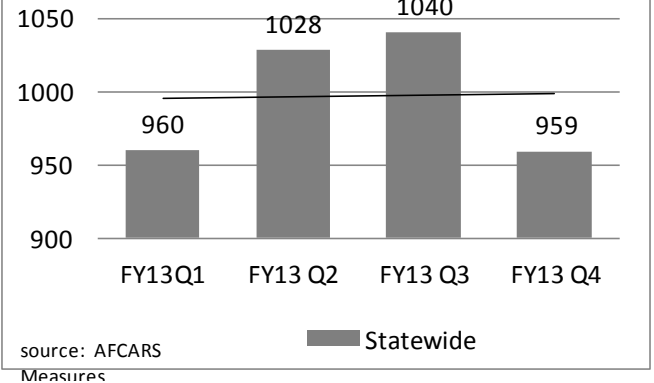


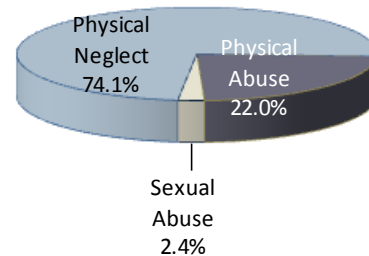
FIGURE5. POINT IN TIME MEASURES: JUNE 30, 2013

About Reports and Investigations

The number of accepted reports of abuse and neglect decreased by 4.1 percent (or 202) from the third to the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2013. During the same time period the number of substantiated investigations increased by 8.7 percent (or 100).

About Adoption

During the third quarter of SFY 2013, 589 Children had “adoption” as a permanency goal. As of March 31, 2013, 329 children were legally freed to be adopted. Of those legally freed, 78 were in adoptive family homes and had an adoptive agreement signed and in effect.

About Recruitment

During the 4th quarter of SFY 2013, 215 applications were received back from applicant inquiries and 441 applications were mailed out, as a part of recruitment program efforts.

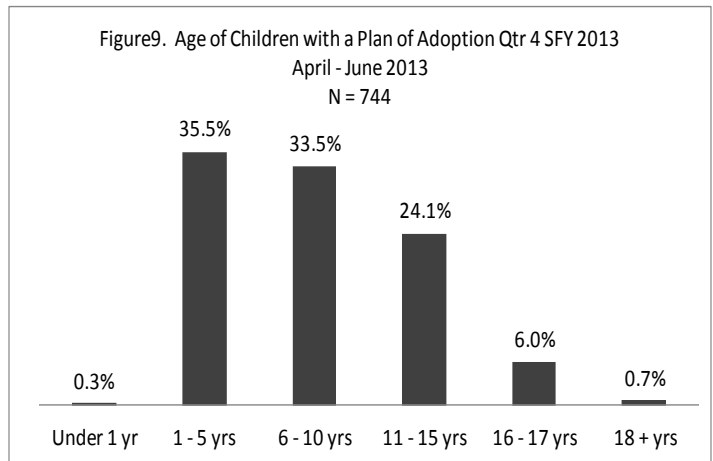


Figure10. Adoption and Foster Care Recruitment Qtr 3 SFY 2013 January — March 2013

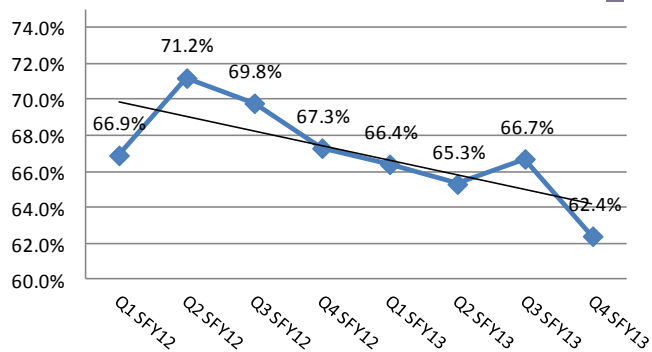

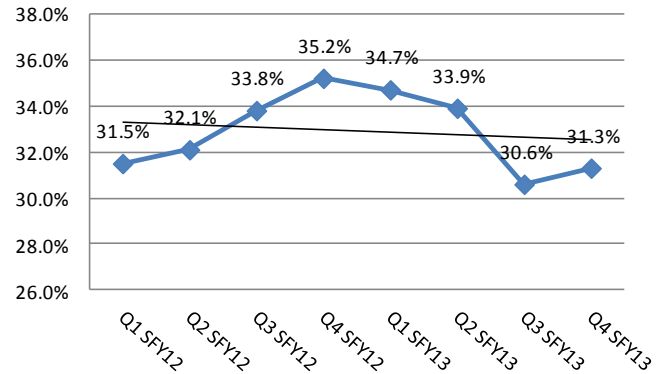

They are less likely to have future justice system contact, substance abuse, mental health issues and homelessness. All children should have the opportunity for permanency and stability in their living situations.

Figure11. Percent of Children Who Reunify In Less Than 12 Months



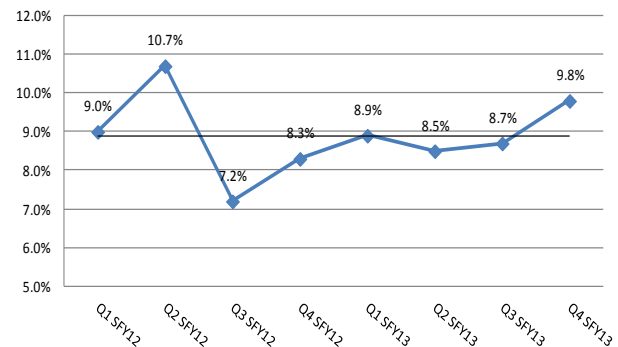

About Legal Cases

The legal case statistics extract is run with data from the previous 18 months. The report selects all case participants who have a legal status record of "Abuse and Neglect Petition" filed in the parameter period.

It is important for every person to take child abuse and neglect seriously and to be able to recognize when it happens. Abuse and neglect may be physical, sexual or emotional.

Physical abuse includes:

1. Cases in which a child exhibits evidence of a skin bruising, bleeding, malnutrition, failure to thrive, burns, fracture of a bone, subdural hematoma, tissue swelling or death, and
2. There is not a justifiable explanation for the condition or death.

Sexual abuse includes:

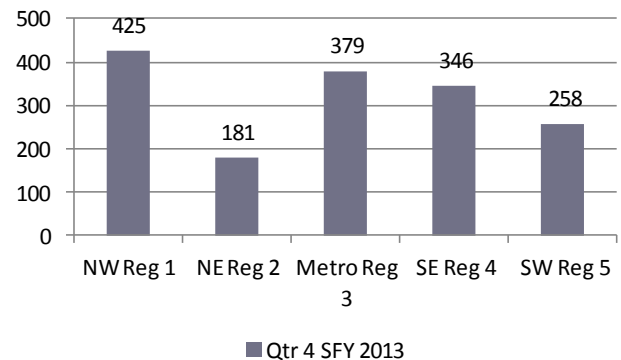
1. Criminal sexual contact
2. Incest or criminal sexual penetration
3. Sexual exploitation (acts such as allowing, permitting or encouraging a child to engage in prostitution or obscene or pornographic photographing, or filming a child for obscene or pornographic commercial purposes)

Neglect includes:

1. The abandonment of a child by a parent, guardian or custodian.
2. The failure of a parent, guardian or custodian to provide a child with proper parental care and control or subsistence, education, medical or other care or control necessary for the child's well being.
3. When a child is physically or sexually abused and the child's parent, guardian or custodian knew or should have known of the abuse and failed to take reasonable steps to protect the child from further harm.

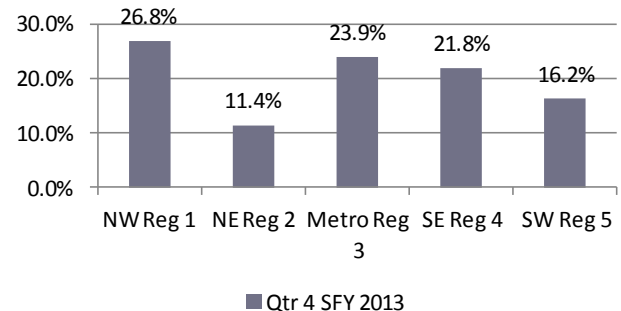
4. Parental inability to discharge their responsibilities to and for the child because of parental incarceration, hospitalization, or physical or mental disorder or incapacity.

18 months Ending 03/31/2013 N = 1,589



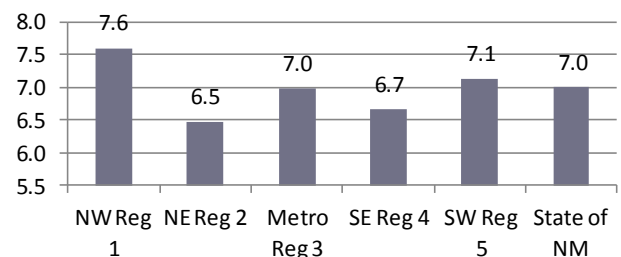

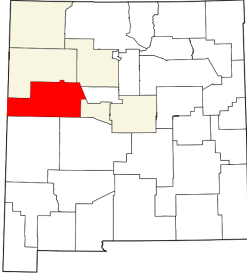
Figure16. Average Months from The first

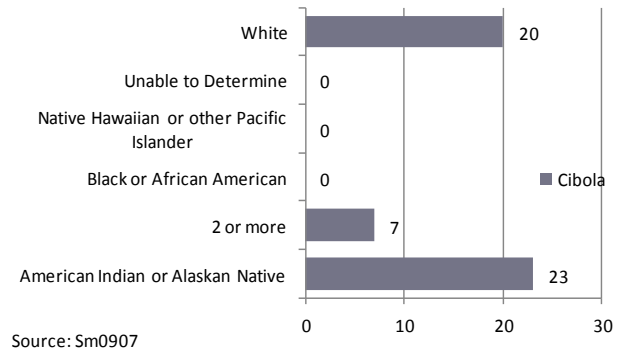

Hispanic Children in Cibola County In Care N = 50



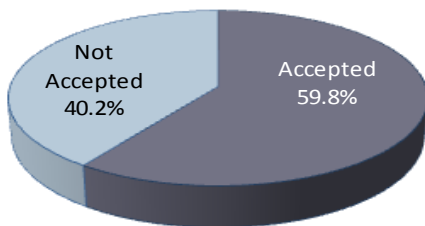

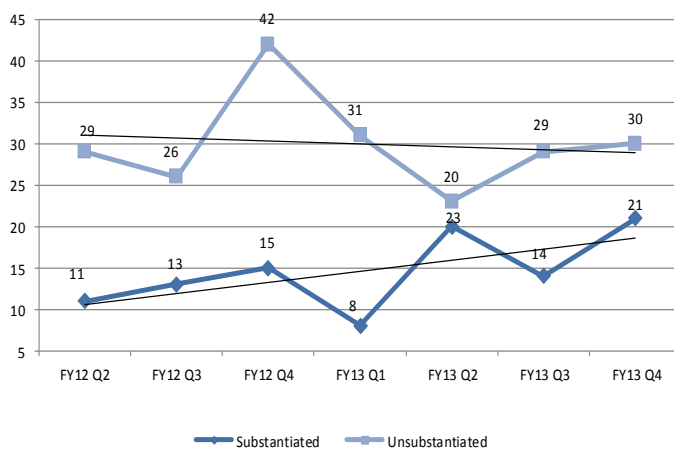

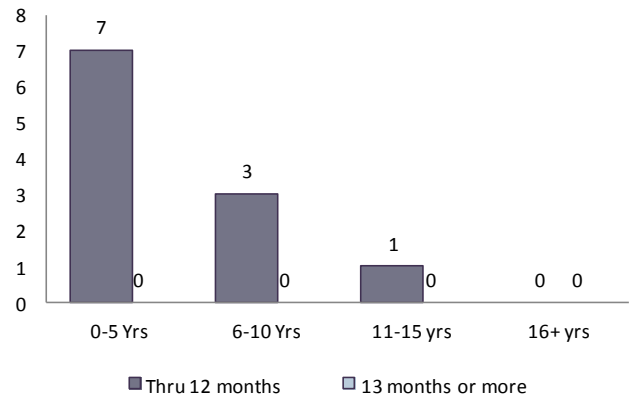


Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody

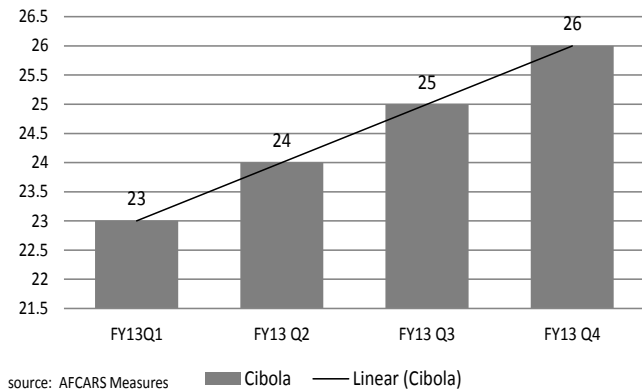

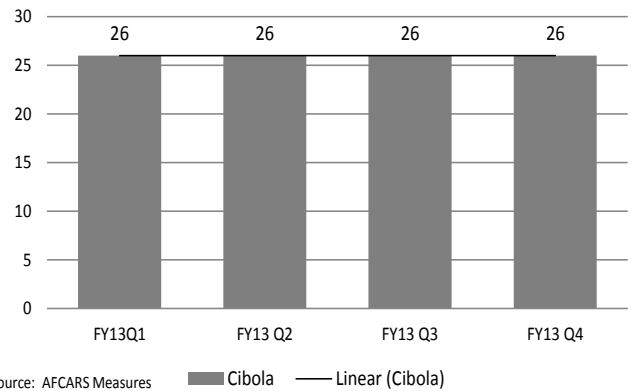

Number of Active Providers with a Foster Care License by Quarter



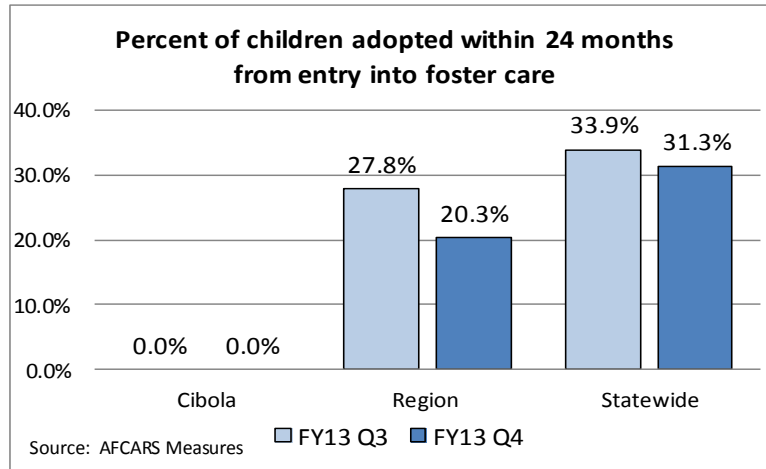

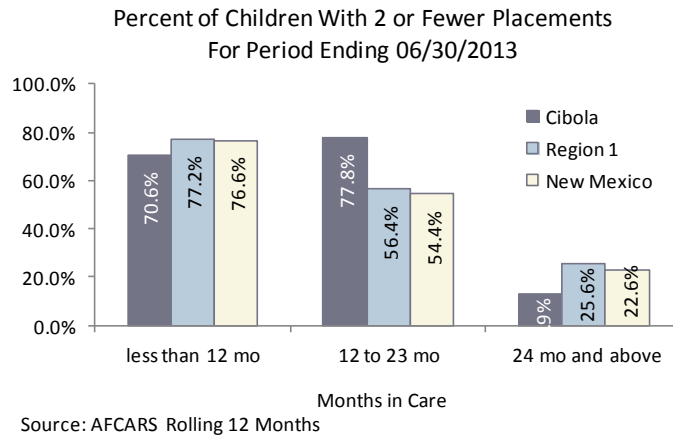


National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) Safety Measures

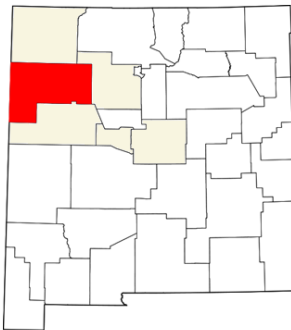

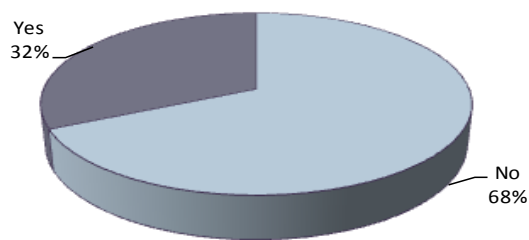

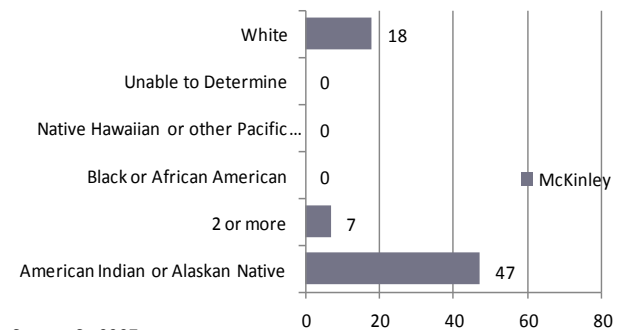

Hispanic Children in McKinley County In Care N = 72



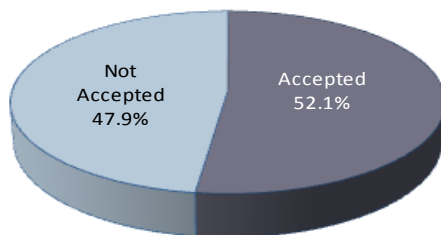

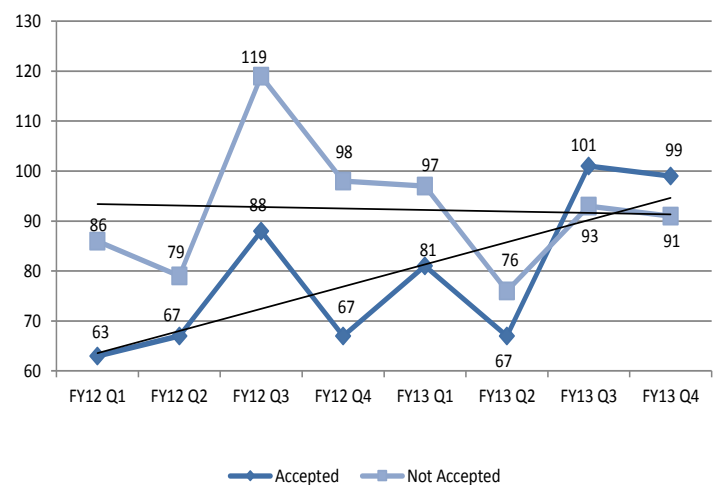

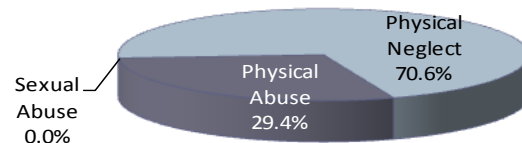

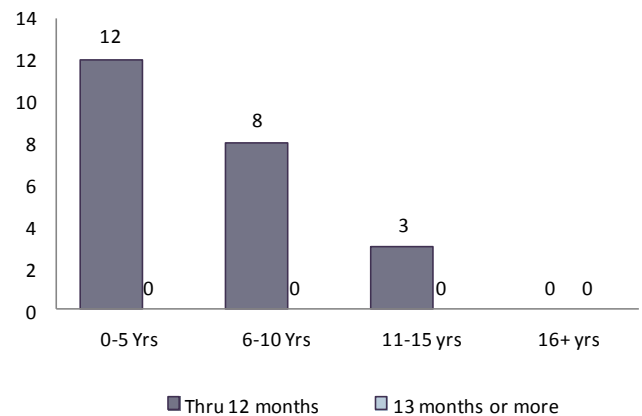
Substantiated and Unsubstantiated Investigations in McKinley County



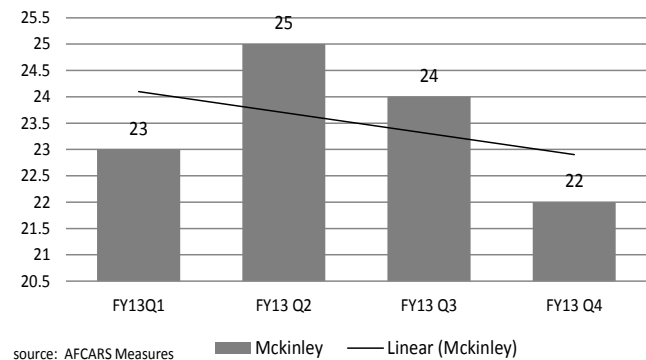
Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody

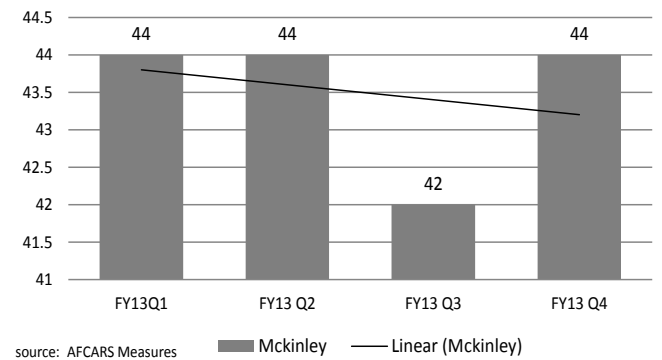

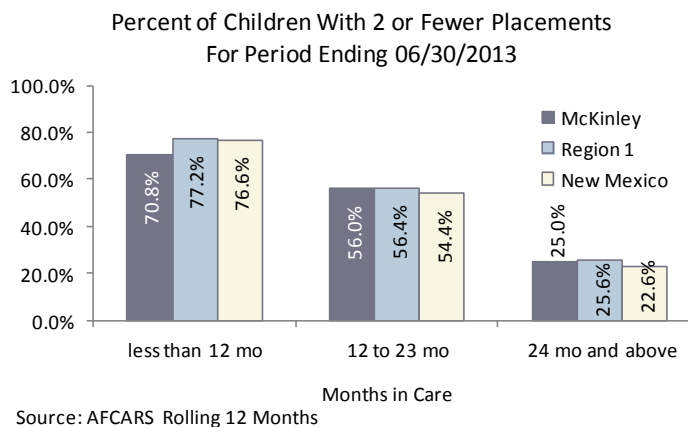


National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) Safety Measures

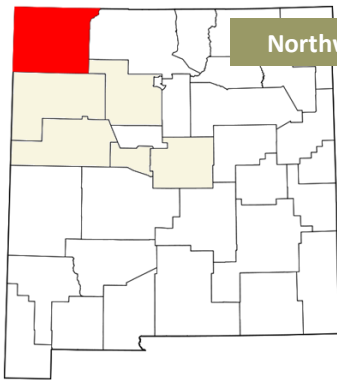

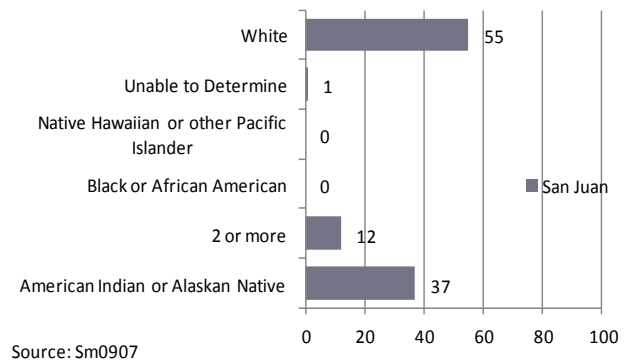

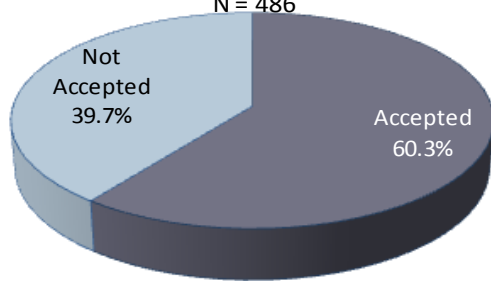

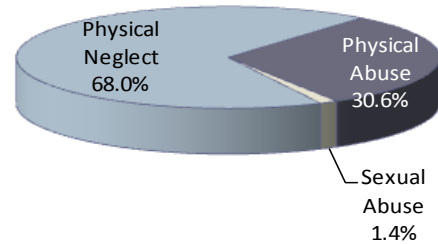

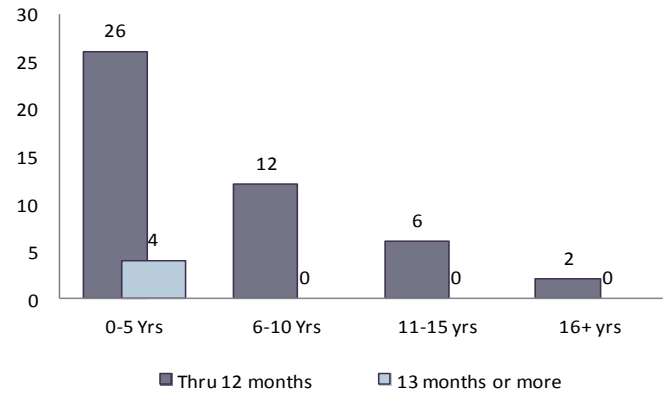
Substantiated and Unsubstantiated Investigations in San Juan County



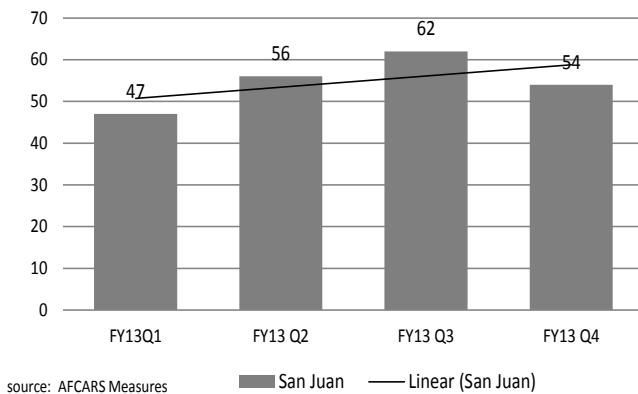
Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody

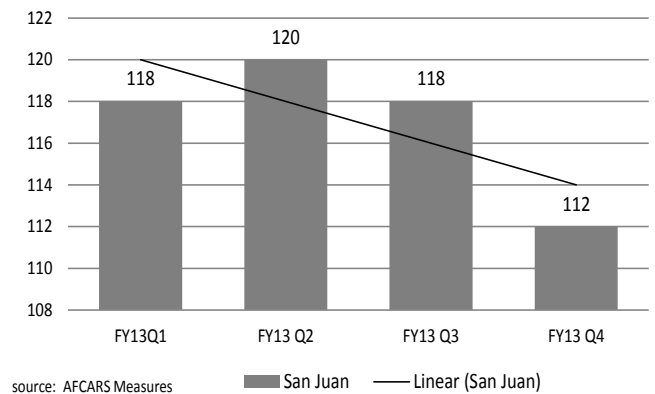

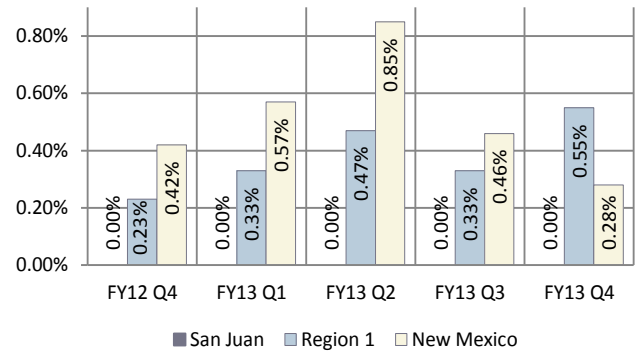

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



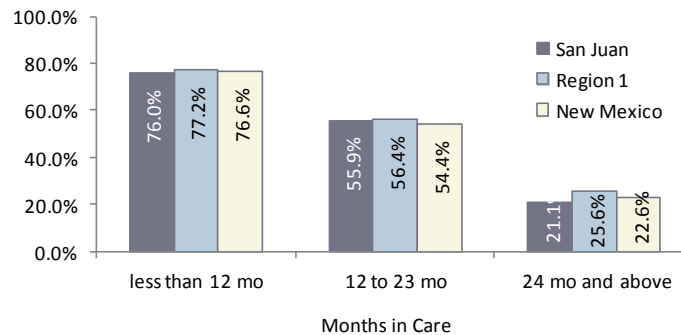

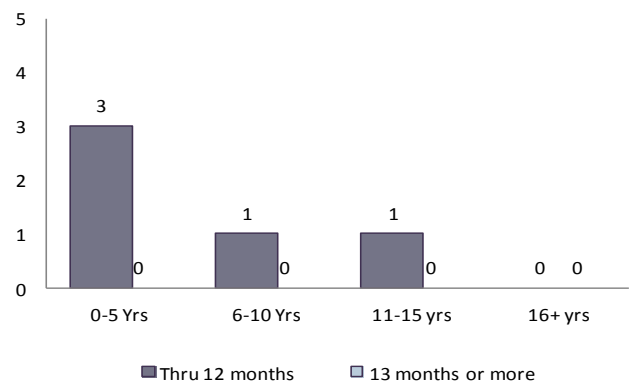

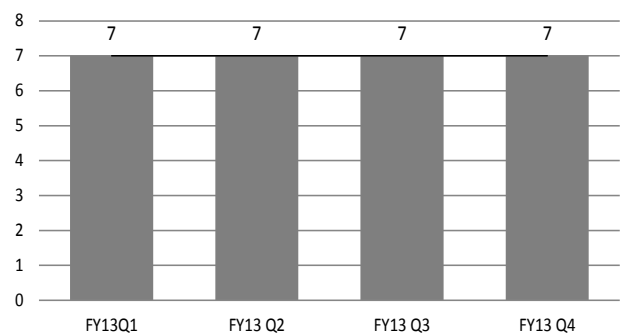
Number of Active Providers with a Foster Care License by Quarter

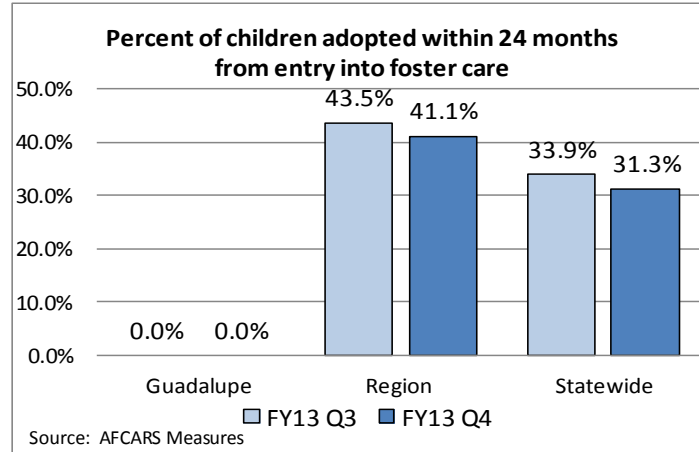

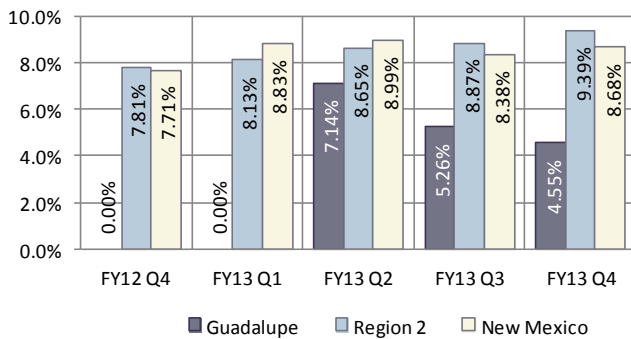

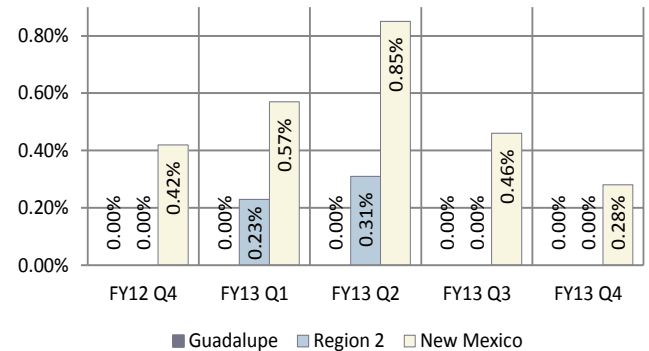

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



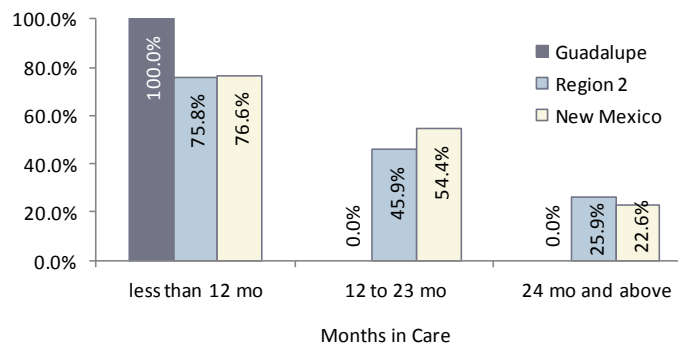

County



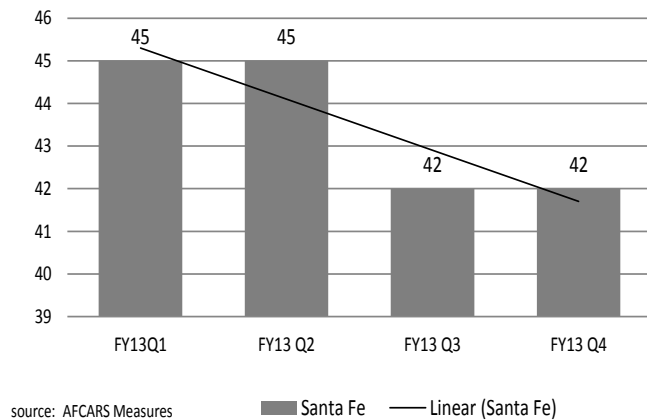

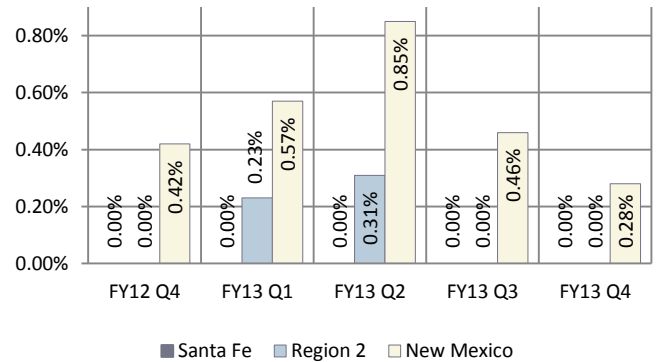

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



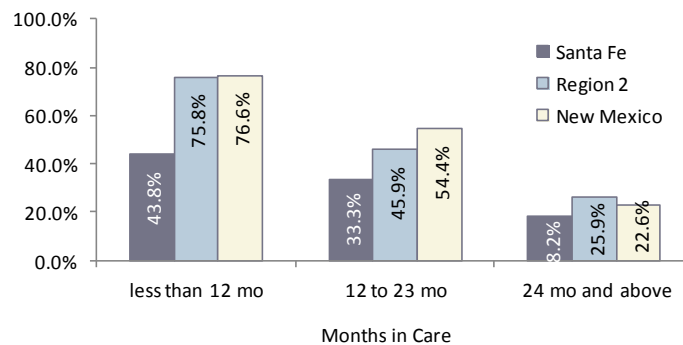

Hispanic Children in Taos County In Care N = 30



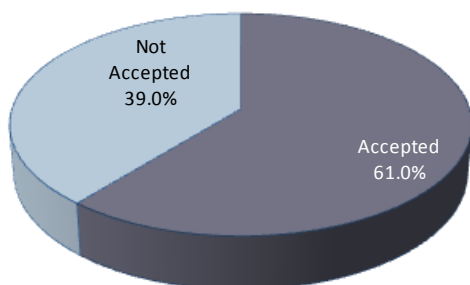

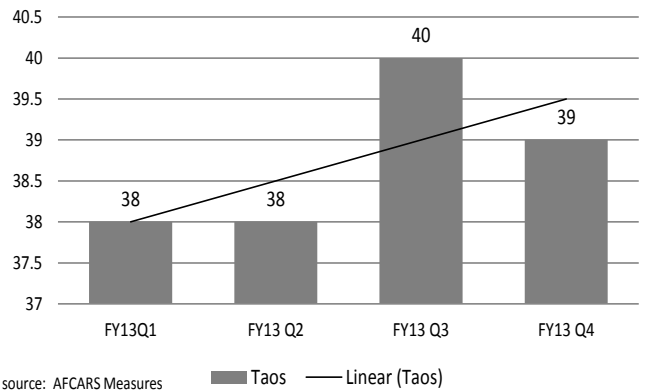
Number of Active Providers with a Foster Care License by Quarter

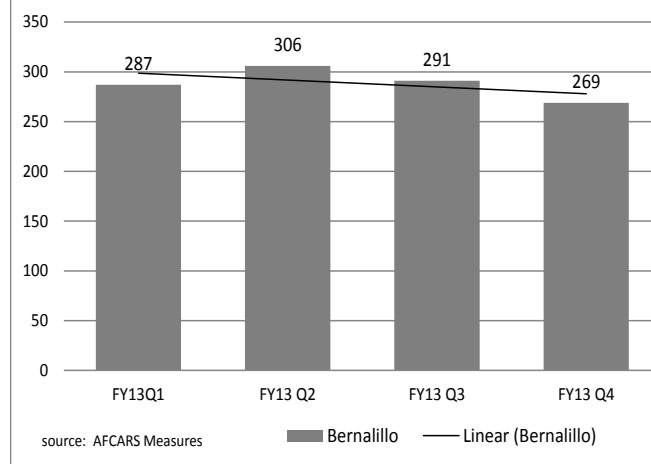

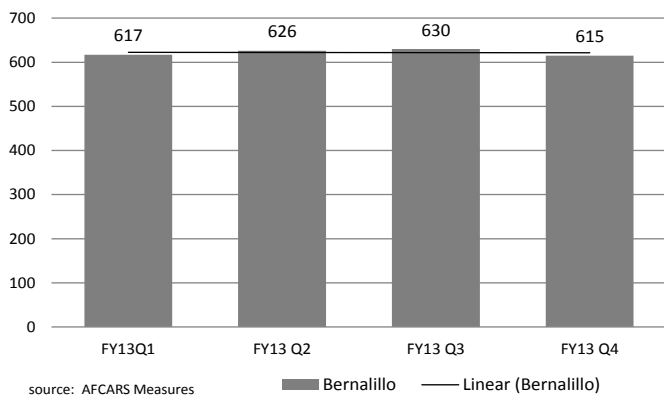
Number of Active Providers with a Foster Care License by Quarter



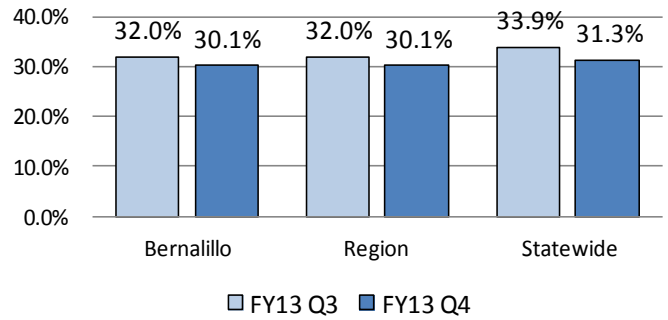

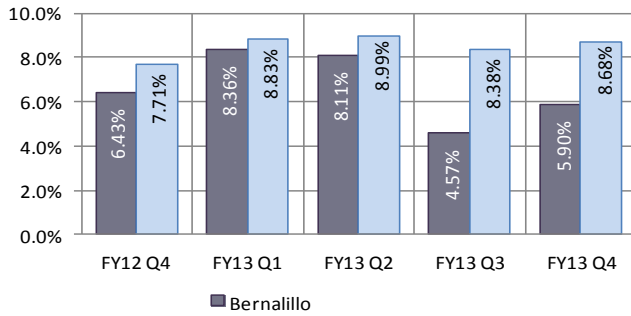


Percent of children adopted within 24 months from entry into foster care

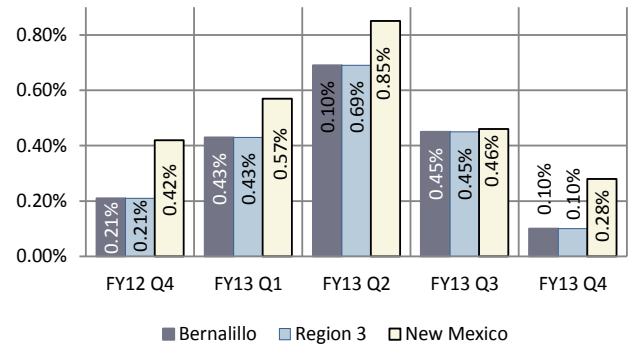

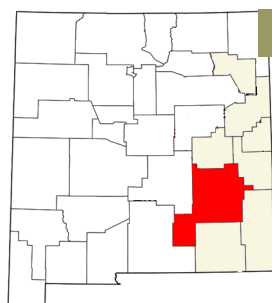

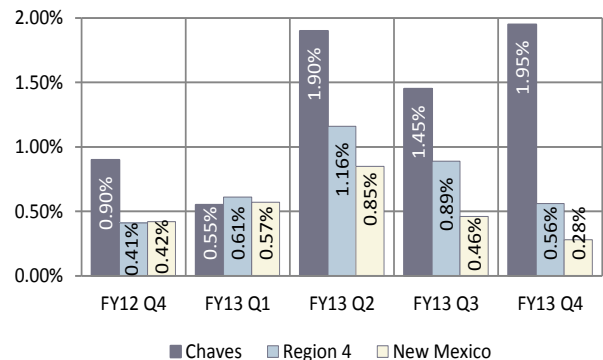

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



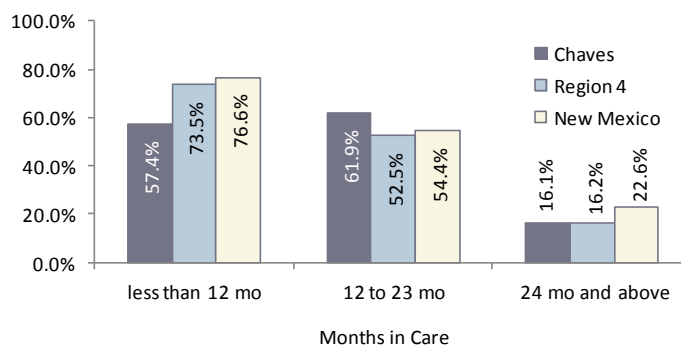

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



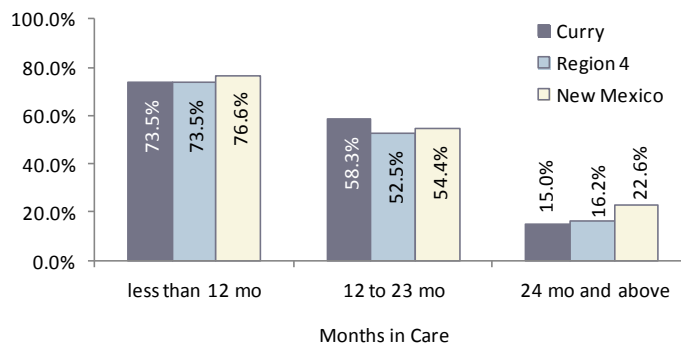

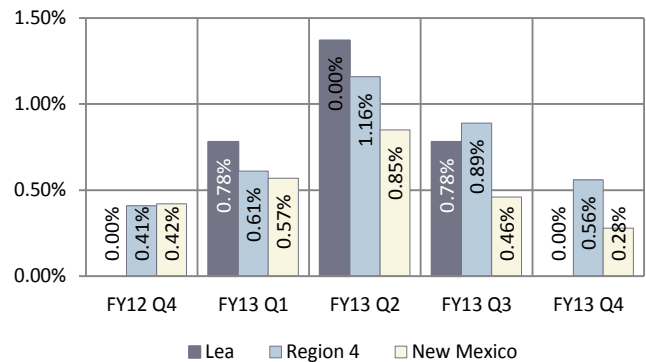

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



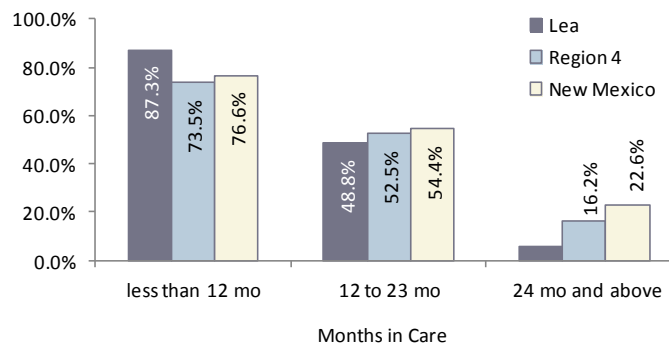

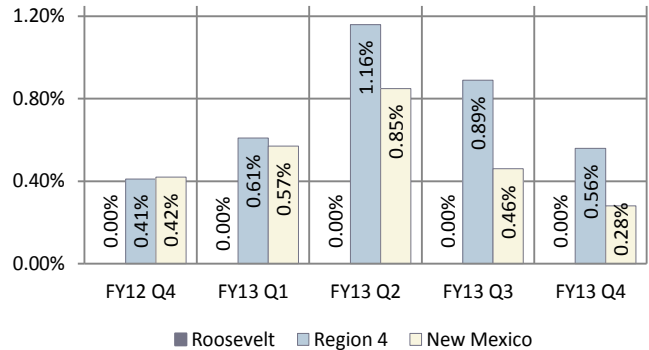

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



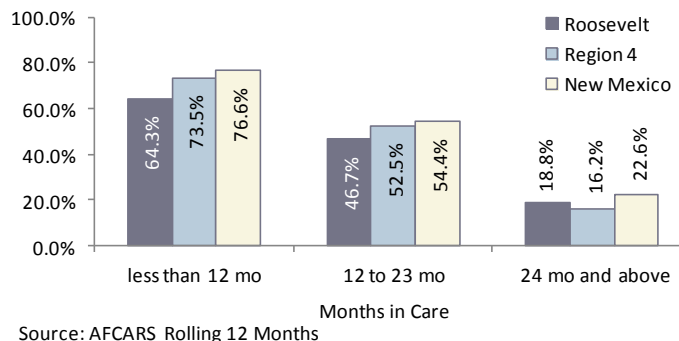

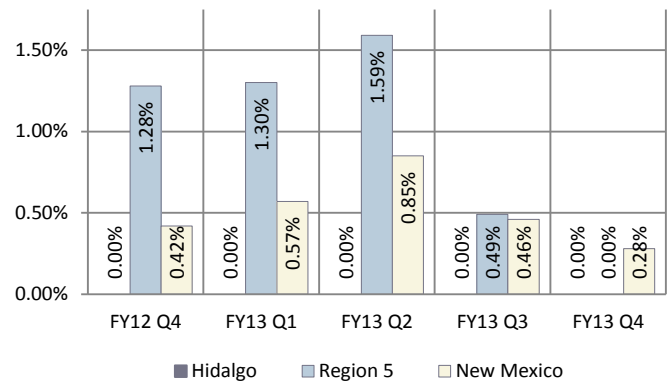

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



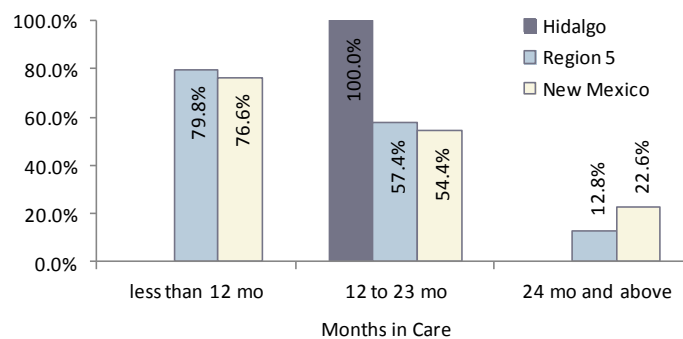

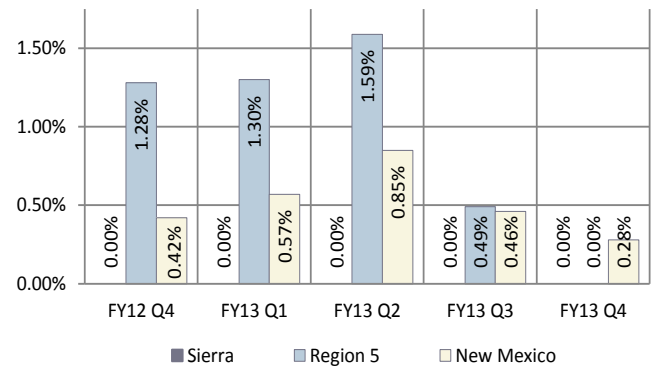

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



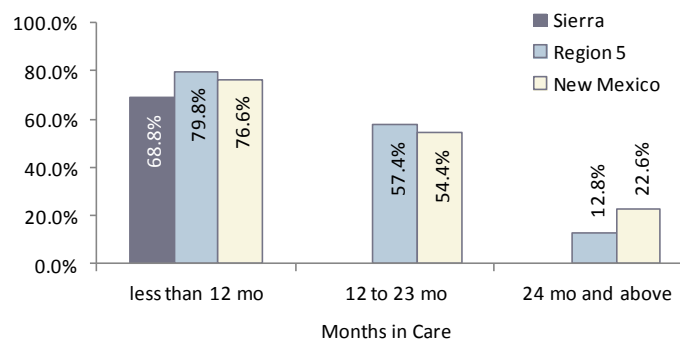
Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%



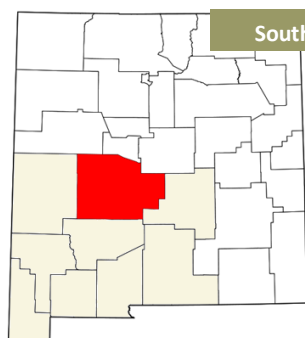

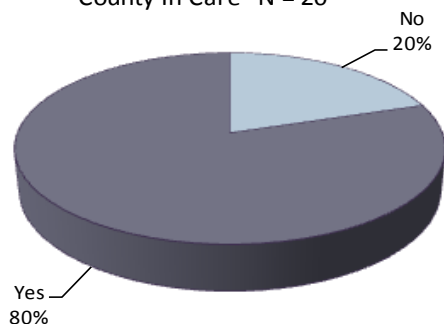

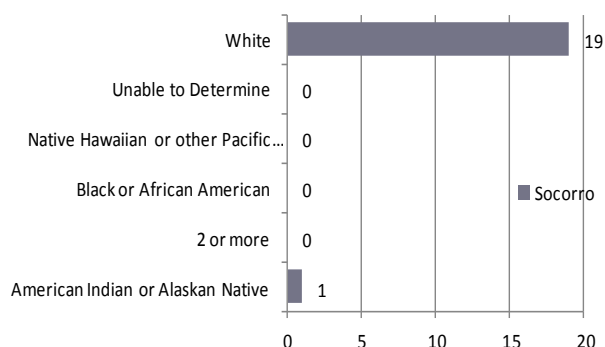

Hispanic Children in Socorro County In Care N = 20



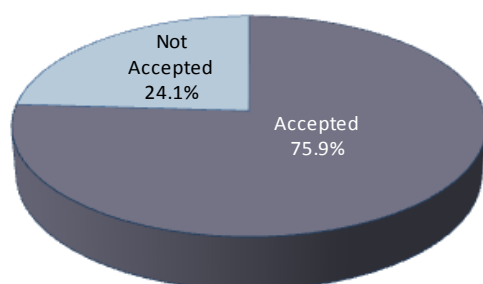

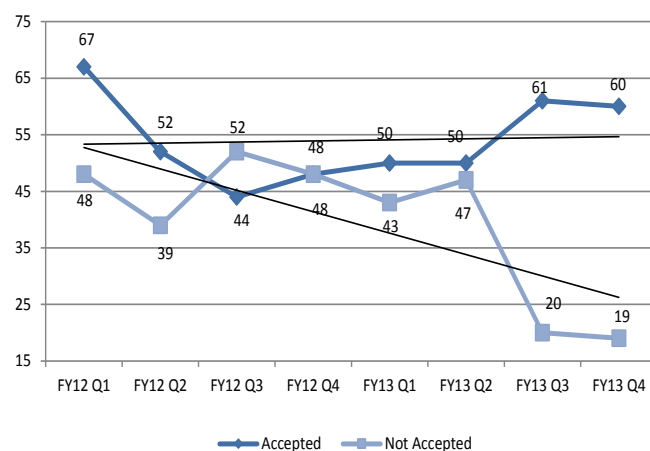

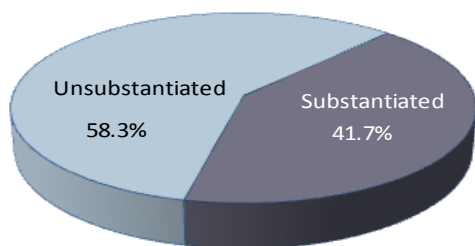

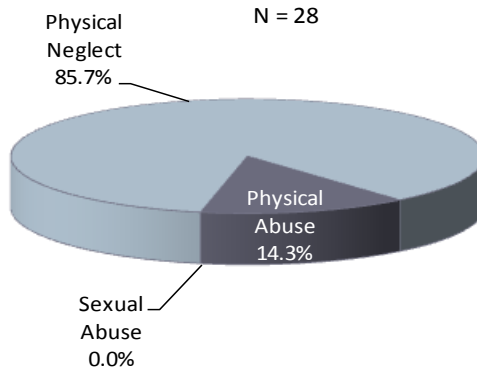

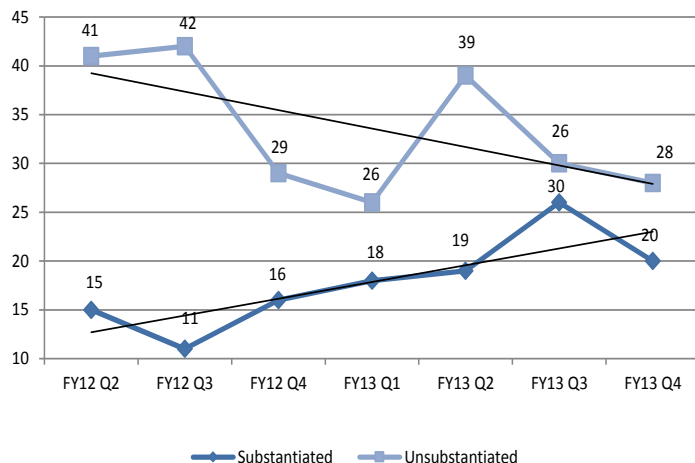

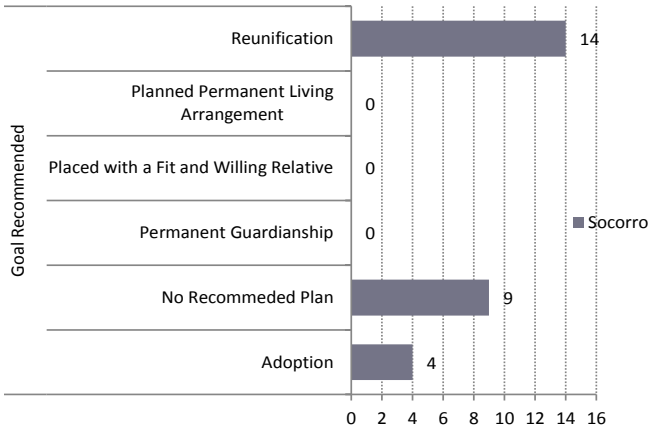

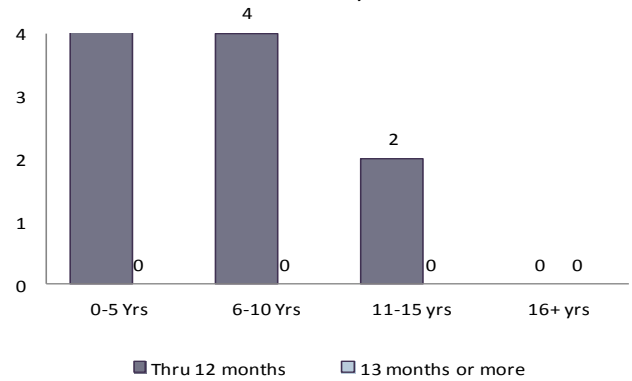


Permanency Plan Goals of Children In Custody
Qtr 4 SFY 2013



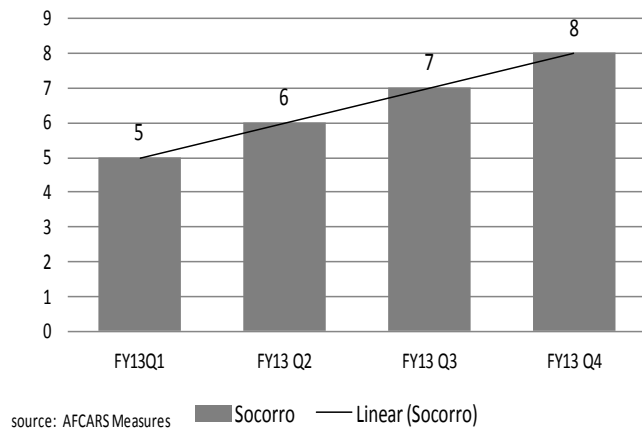

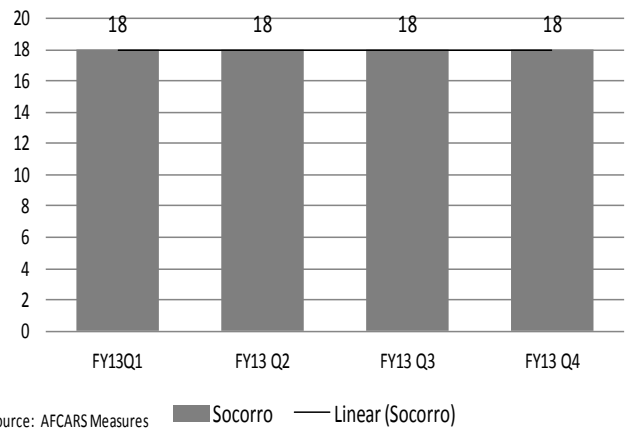

Number of Active Providers with a Foster Care License by Quarter



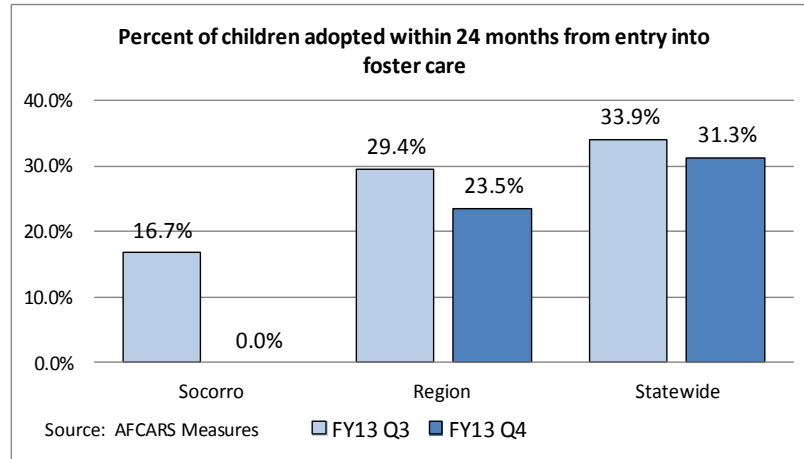

Number of Active Providers with an Adoption License by Quarter



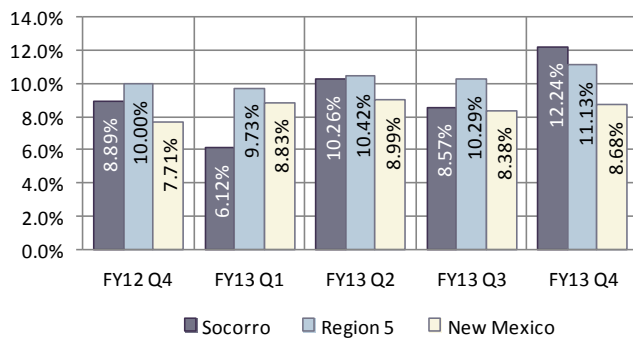

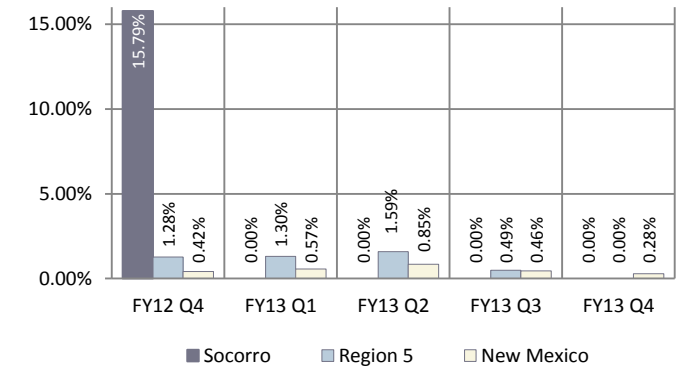


National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) Safety Measures

Trends of Recurrence of Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment National Standard = 5.4%



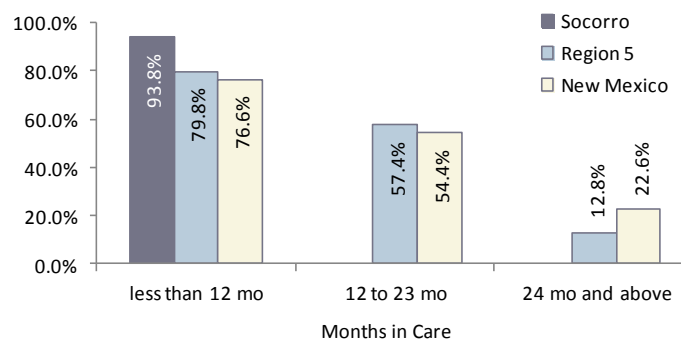
Trends of Maltreatment in Foster Care National Standard = 0.32%
