About the 360 Report

The 360 Report is published quarterly to provide CYFD management, staff, external partners and stakeholders with data related to:

- Reports of child abuse and neglect;
- Investigations of child abuse and neglect;
- Substantiated child abuse and neglect;
- Permanency plans for children in custody;
- Number of children and youth in foster care;

And other measures of child safety, permanency, and well being.

These data can be used to inform New Mexicans of trends in a particular area and where support may be needed. Data can also indicate positive outcomes in an aspect of the system in a particular county or region. The 360 Report is a tool that can bring science to inform the prevention and treatment process.

About the Data

Data for the County Profiles are prepared through the collaborative efforts of the Data Evaluation Unit and FACTS Unit within CYFD's Research, Assessment and Data Bureau, and Information Technology Services. Additional assistance and guidance is provided by the US Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Administration on Children, Youth and Families, Children's Bureau.

About Protective Services

Protective Services strives to enhance the safety, permanency, and well being of children and families in New Mexico.

Protective Services workers investigate reports of child maltreatment and intervene to keep New Mexico's children safe. We provide foster care to approximately 2,500 children each day and work with families to enable parents to safely care for their children. When that cannot be accomplished, Protective Services finds safe, permanent families for children through adoption or permanent guardianship.

Protective Services also works with youth emancipating from the foster care system to help them successfully transition into adult-hood.















J1 New Mexico Sibling Groups in Foster Care






This graph shows the percentage of children entering foster care in New Mexico who leave care within 8 days, for the last eight quarters. Source: sm0904



01 New Mexico Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P1 New Mexico Active Providers by License Type: Trends





Q1 New Mexico Provider Inquiries by Referral Source








VI New Mexico Children who Re-Enter Care within 12 Months















This chart shows the number of entries into, and exits from, foster care in Cibola County for the last eight quarters. Some children may enter and exit care within the same quarter. Source: sm0904







J2 Cibola Sibling Groups in Foster Care








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

02 Cibola Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P2 Cibola Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R2 Cibola Case Worker Vacancy Rates



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









This chart shows the number of entries into, and exits from, foster care in McKinley County for the last eight quarters. Some children may enter and exit care within the same quarter. Source: sm0904







J3 McKinley Sibling Groups in Foster Care




This chart shows the number of different sibling group sizes in foster care in McKinley County, as of the end of the quarter. Source: AFCARS









03 McKinley Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P3 McKinley Active Providers by License Type: Trends








San Juan County: Intakes & Investigations









This chart shows the number of entries into, and exits from, foster care in San Juan County for the last eight quarters. Some children may enter and exit care within the same quarter. Source: sm0904






J4 San Juan Sibling Groups in Foster Care



This chart shows the number of different sibling group sizes in foster care in San Juan County, as of the end of the quarter. Source: AFCARS



L4 San Juan Permanency Goals of Children in Care





N4 San Juan Placement Stability: Trends







P4 San Juan Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R4 San Juan Case Worker Vacancy Rates













J5 Sandoval Sibling Groups in Foster Care











P5 Sandoval Active Providers by License Type: Trends





Q5 Sandoval Provider Inquiries by Referral Source













J6 Torrance Sibling Groups in Foster Care











P6 Torrance Active Providers by License Type: Trends















J7 Valencia Sibling Groups in Foster Care







Q7 Valencia Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends















E8 Colfax/Union Investigation Dispositions



















P8 Colfax/Union Active Providers by License Type: Trends





Q8 Colfax/Union Provider Inquiries by Referral Source




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R8 Colfax/Union Case Worker Vacancy Rates







D9 Guadalupe/Mora/San Miguel Substantiated Allegations by Type SFY 2016, 1st Quarter: N=173







F9 Guadalupe/Mora/San Miguel Repeat Maltreatment: Trends













P9 Guadalupe/Mora/San Miguel Active Providers by License Type: Trends











E10 Los Alamos/Rio Arriba Investigation Dispositions





FIO Los Alamos/Rio Arriba Repeat Maltreatment: Trends

















P10 Los Alamos/Rio Arriba Active Providers by License Type: Trends







































J12 Taos Sibling Groups in Foster Care











P12 Taos Active Providers by License Type: Trends












J13 Bernalillo Sibling Groups in Foster Care



K13 Bernalillo "Short Stays" in Foster Care: Trends





L13 Bernalillo Permanency Goals of Children in Care











P13 Bernalillo Active Providers by License Type: Trends













J14 Bernalillo East Sibling Groups in Foster Care





K14 Bernalillo East "Short Stays" in Foster Care: Trends













J15 Bernalillo West Sibling Groups in Foster Care





KIS Bernalillo West "Short Stays" in Foster Care: Trends



Bernalillo West: Case Worker Vacancy Rates

























D16 Chaves Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P16 Chaves Active Providers by License Type: Trends

























P17 Curry Active Providers by License Type: Trends

























P18 De Baca/Harding/Quay Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R18 De Baca/Harding/Quay Case Worker Vacancy Rates













J19 Eddy Sibling Groups in Foster Care













P19 Eddy Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R19 Eddy Case Worker Vacancy Rates











J20 Lea Sibling Groups in Foster Care











P20 Lea Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R20 Lea Case Worker Vacancy Rates





E21 Roosevelt Investigation Dispositions





F21 Roosevelt Repeat Maltreatment: Trends







P21 Roosevelt Active Providers by License Type: Trends














J22 Catron/Grant Sibling Groups in Foster Care



K22 Catron/Grant "Short Stays" in Foster Care: Trends





L22 Catron/Grant Permanency Goals of Children in Care







Q22 Catron/Grant Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P22 Catron/Grant Active Providers by License Type: Trends





























P23 Doña Ana Active Providers by License Type: Trends























P24 Hidalgo/Luna Active Providers by License Type: Trends

































J26 Otero Sibling Groups in Foster Care




This chart shows the number of different sibling group sizes in foster care in Otero County, as of the end of the quarter. Source: AFCARS









P26 Otero Active Providers by License Type: Trends






R26 Otero Case Worker Vacancy Rates













J27 Sierra Sibling Groups in Foster Care




This chart shows the number of different sibling group sizes in foster care in Sierra County, as of the end of the quarter. Source: AFCARS







P27 Sierra Active Providers by License Type: Trends





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


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


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


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Socorro County: Children in Care

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





028 Socorro Maltreatment in Foster Care: Trends





P28 Socorro Active Providers by License Type: Trends




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Q28 Socorro Provider Inquiries by Referral Source
