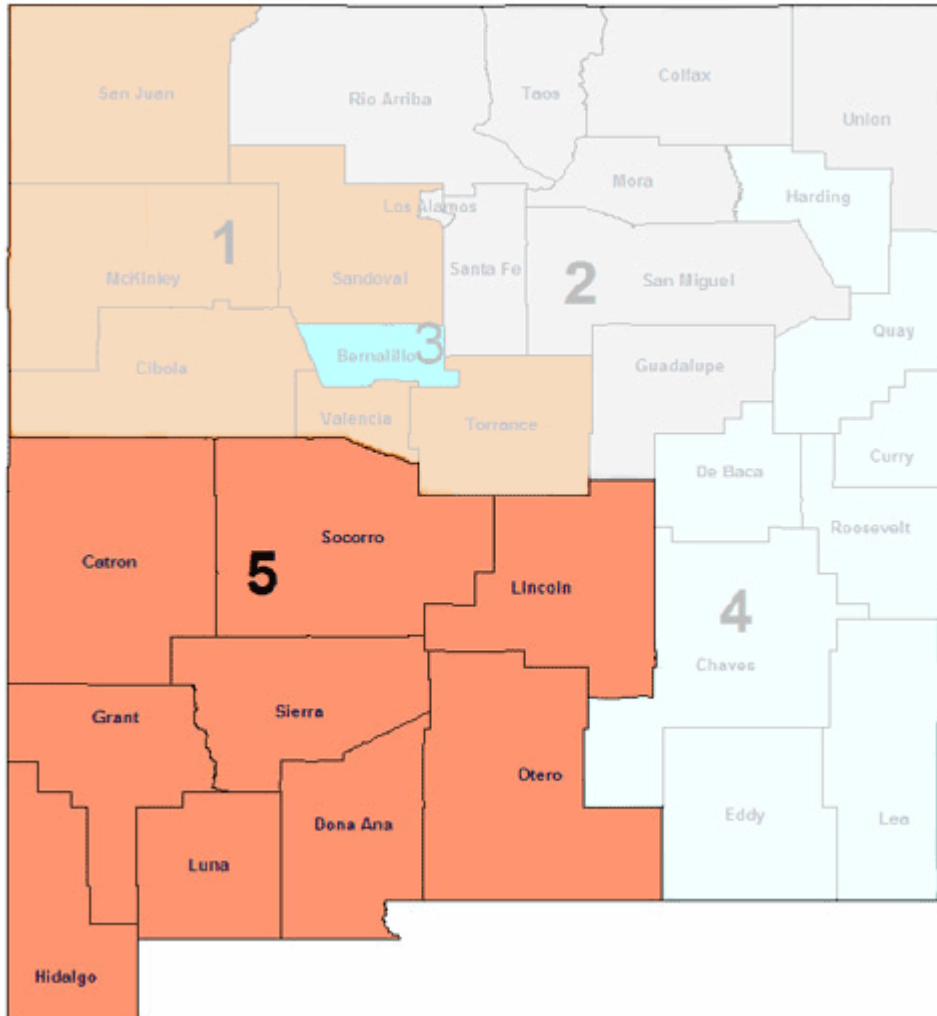

Did You Know???

Did You Know that according to the most recent data from the United States Census Bureau for New Mexico (2005), one in four children in our state live in families with incomes below the federal poverty level? Due to the profound effect that socioeconomic context has on children and families, the topics of poverty and economic resources are critical considerations for child welfare outcomes.

Income and Reports of Maltreatment

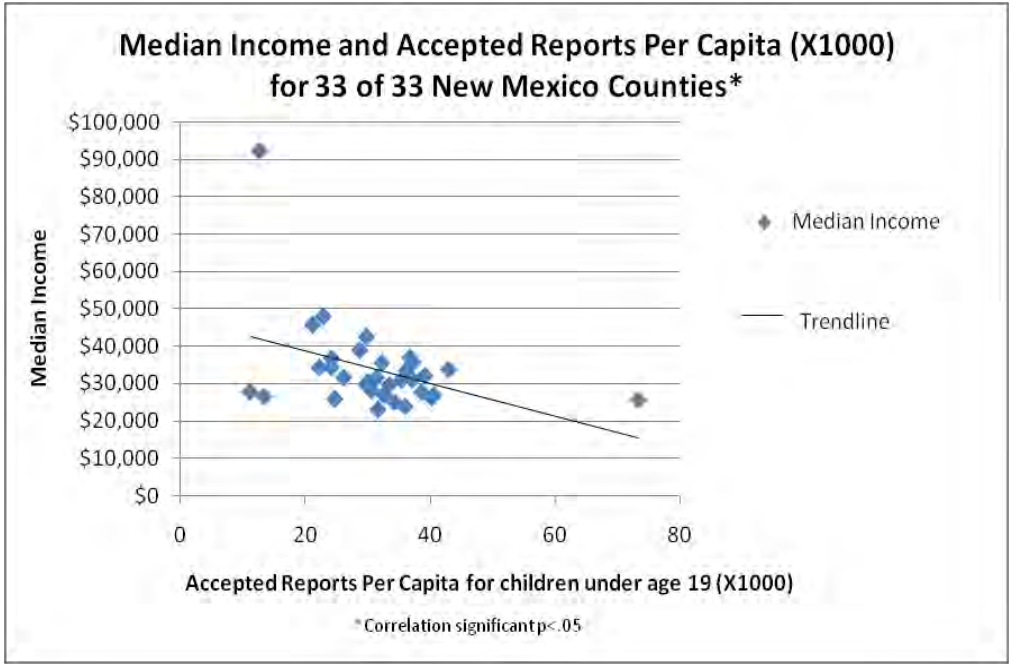
In New Mexico children live under very diverse economic conditions. Ranging from the high of 41% in one county to under 1% in another county, New Mexico is well above the 2005 U.S. level of 18.5% of children in poverty. It is well established that as family income decreases, incidence of maltreatment increases^{1,2}. A recent study was conducted by the Research and Evaluation Unit in which the relationship between median income for individuals in each New Mexico county and the number of reports of child maltreatment that CYFD received in 2007 was examined. Researchers found a significant relationship (correlation) between decreasing median income and increases in both accepted and total reports of child maltreatment (See Figure below for median income and accepted reports).

An Impact

Although it cannot be concluded that a lower median income increases the chances of Protective Services accepting a report of abuse, such data on median income and accepted reports, along with converging evidence on the relationship between poverty and maltreatment supports the idea that a lack of socioeconomic resources has an impact on the Child Welfare System in New Mexico.

A Complex Problem

Poverty alone cannot be used as a benchmark for child welfare workers because poverty is only one part of the story. Notably, there is a wide variety of related contributors to maltreatment of children, including but not limited to a lack of general resources, family structure, substance abuse, and extended periods of economic recession. Protective Services continues to work with families and communities facing these challenges to provide support and services to meet the complex needs of all children and families in New Mexico's child welfare system.

Protective Services Initiatives

- To continue efforts ensuring timely response to reports of maltreatment, enhancing voluntary services to at risk families, providing safe homes for children in out-of-home care, and working with families to address the risk issues that contribute to child maltreatment
- To improve outcomes addressing the unique need of older youth in faster care in the areas of education, financial assistance and housing
- To enhance visitation with children in foster care through staff training, tracking mechanisms and quality assurance reviews
- To expand foster and adoptive family recruitment efforts to increasing the number of placement resources available for children needing homes
- To partner with the New Mexico Court Improvement Project and the courts to expedite permanency for children by reducing delays, minimizing the need for continuances, expediting appeals and enhancing the quality of representation
- To facilitate the active engagement of parents, foster parents and youth in case planning through Team Decision Making, adoption mediation, video conference and increasing the participation of incarcerated parents

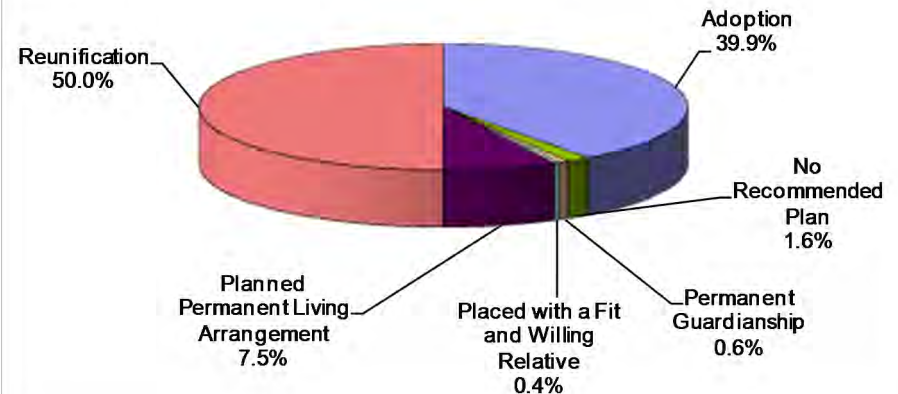

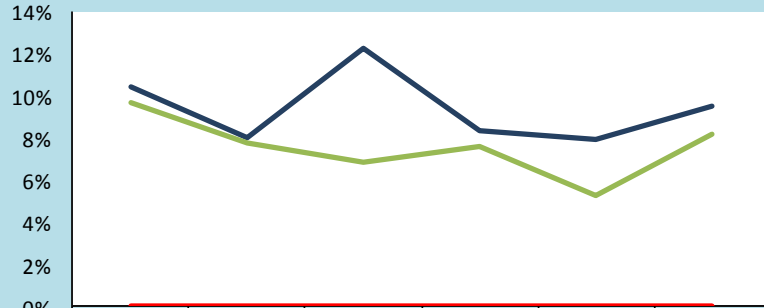

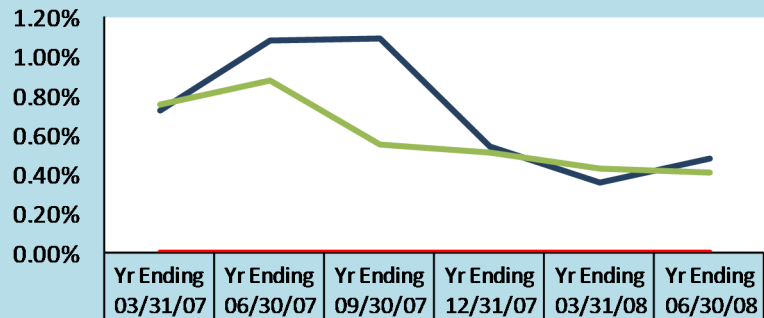

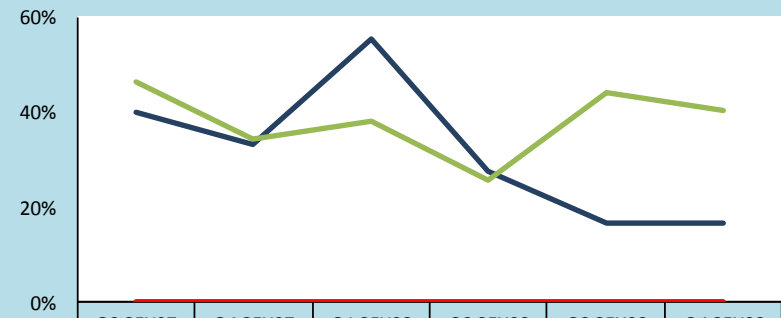

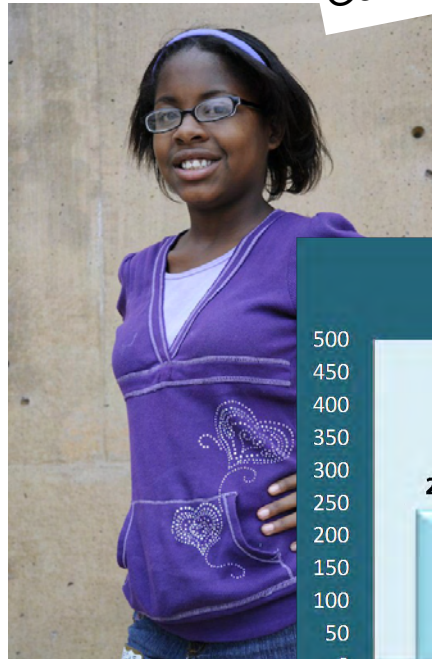

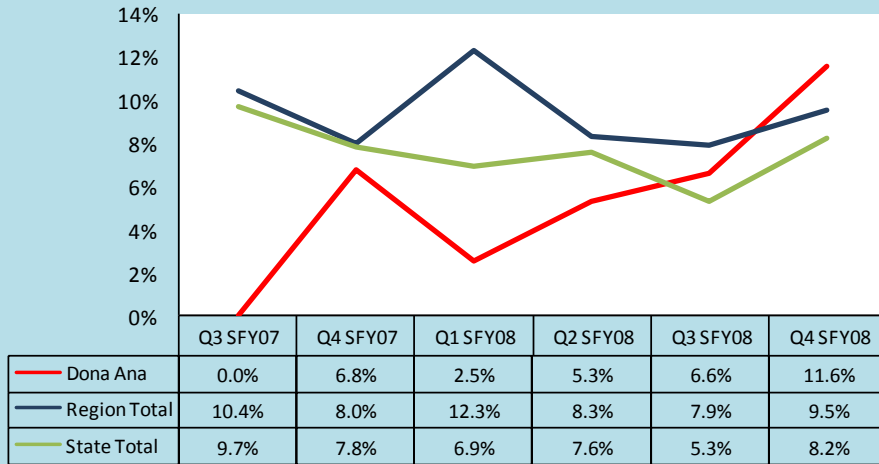

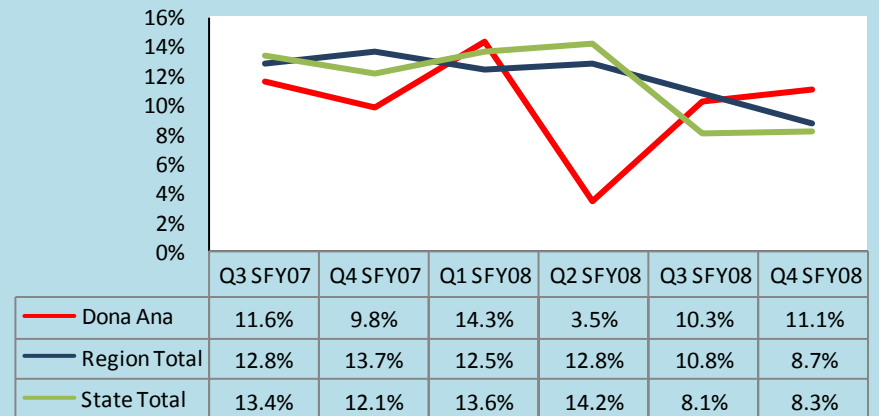

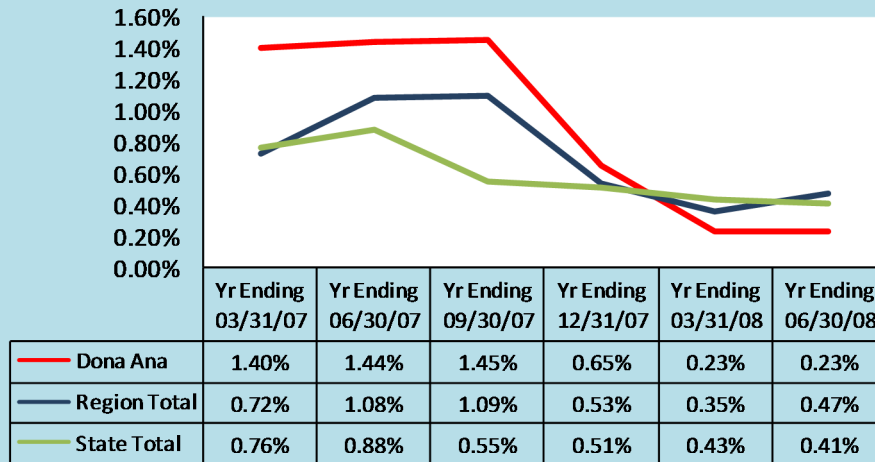
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

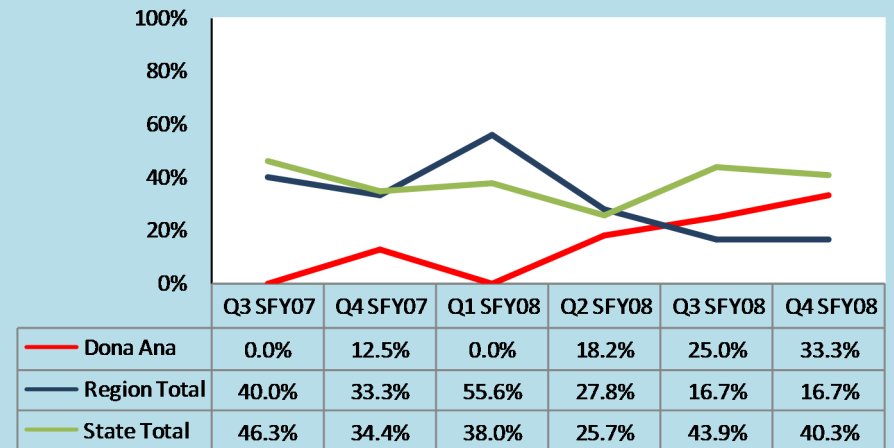
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of A Prior Episode

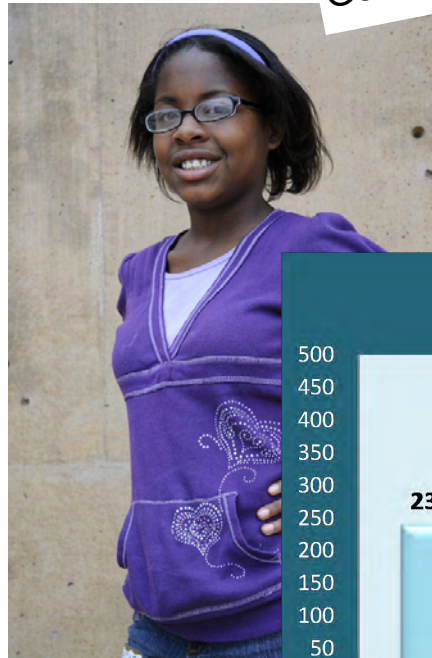

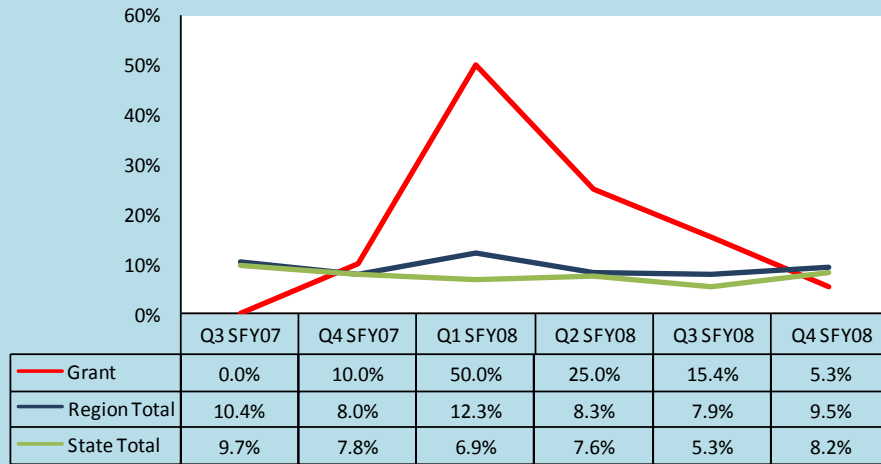

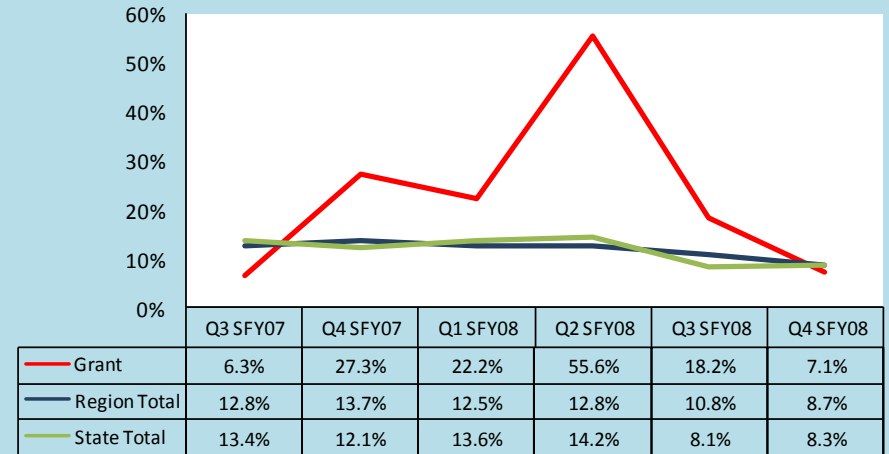

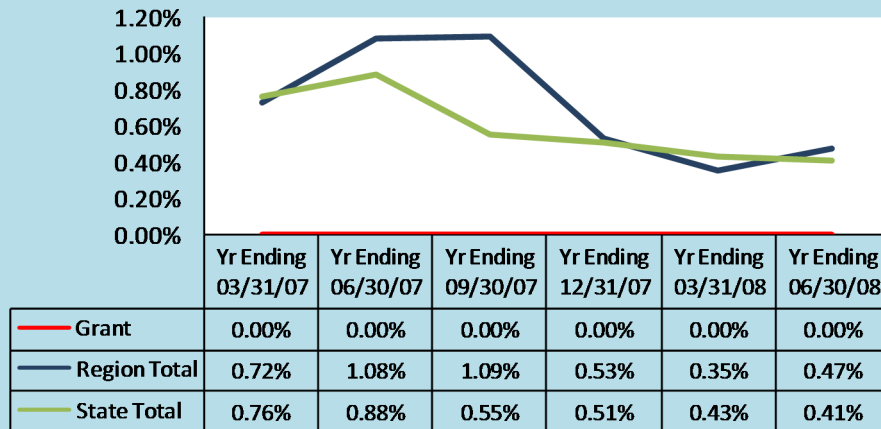
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

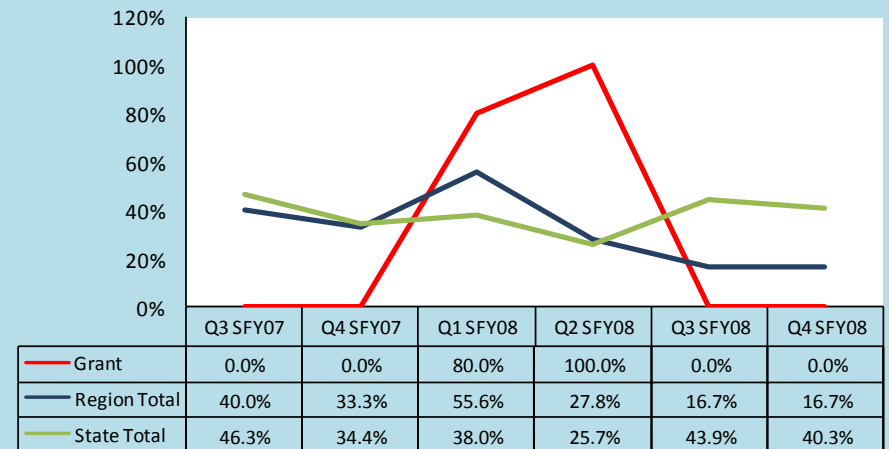
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of A Prior Episode

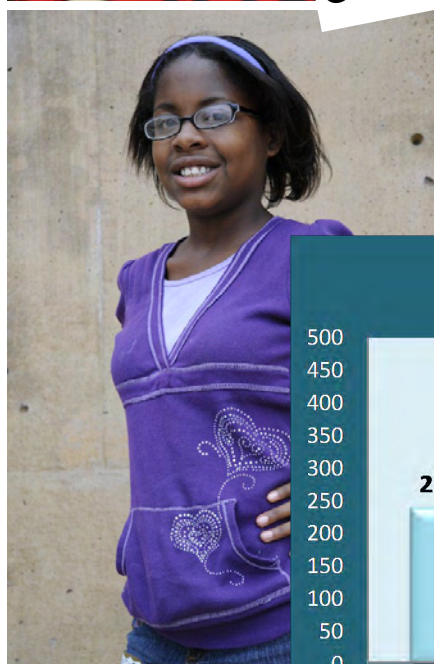

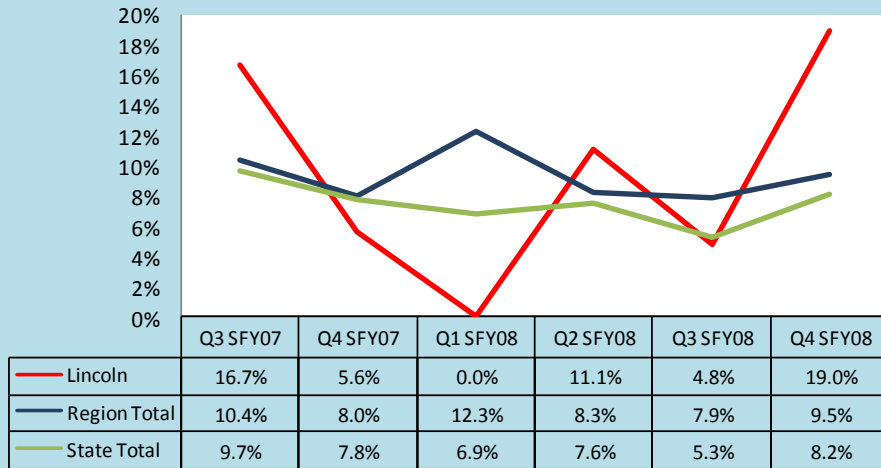

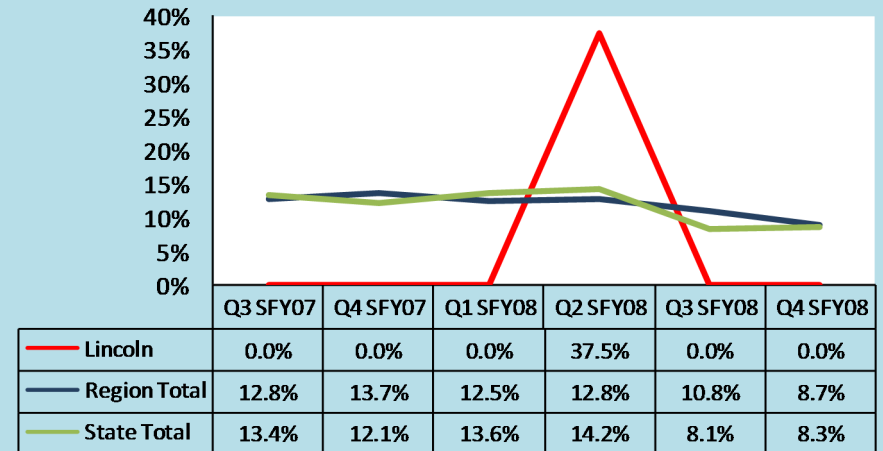

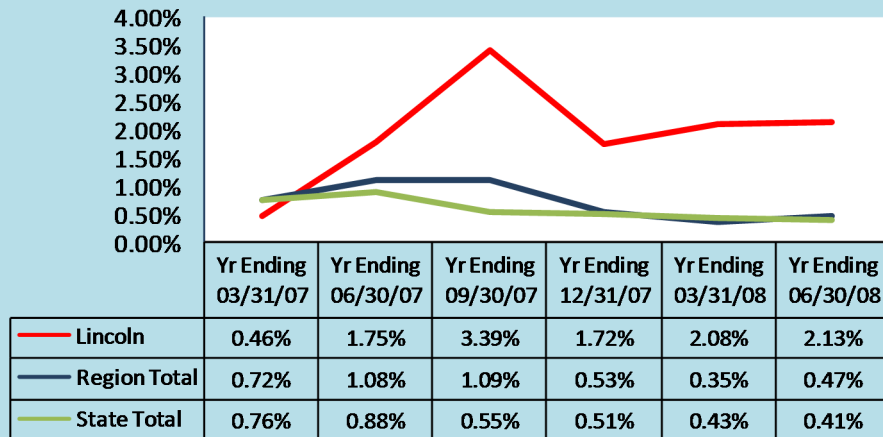
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

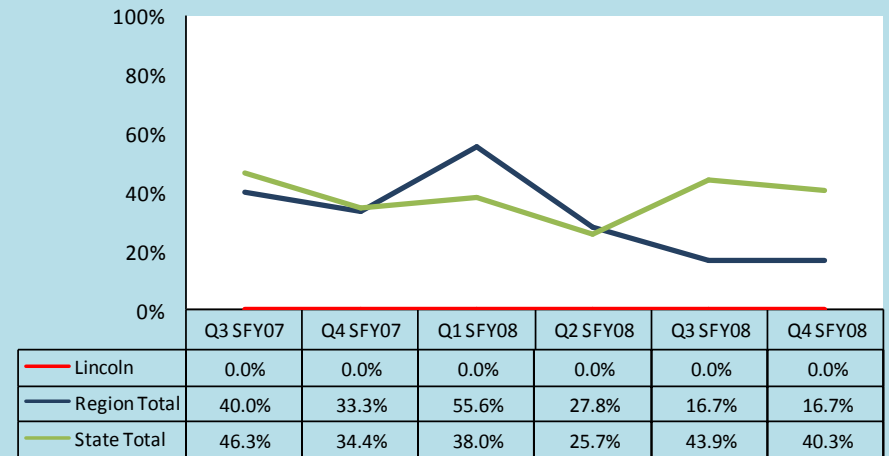
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of a Prior Episode

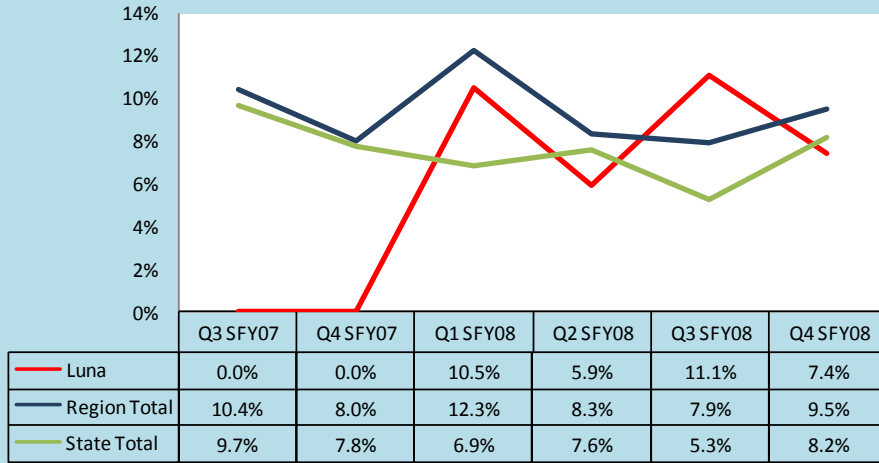

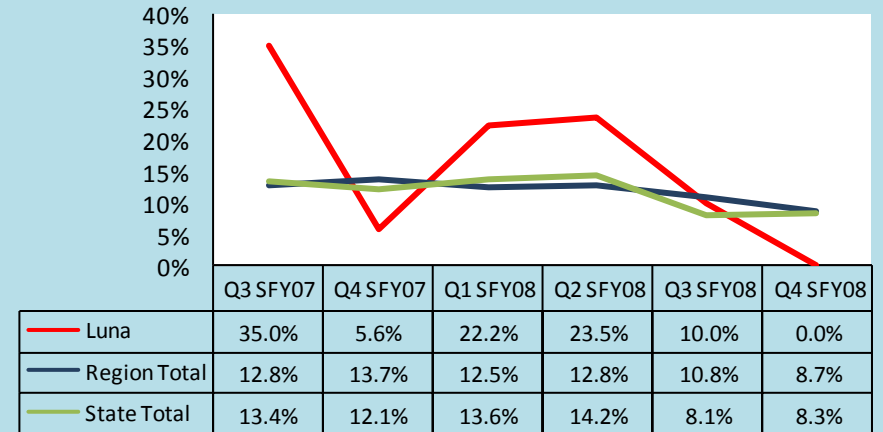

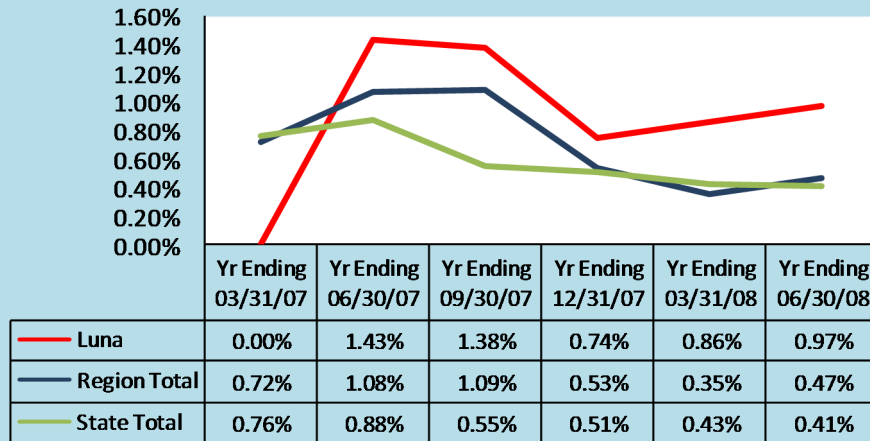
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

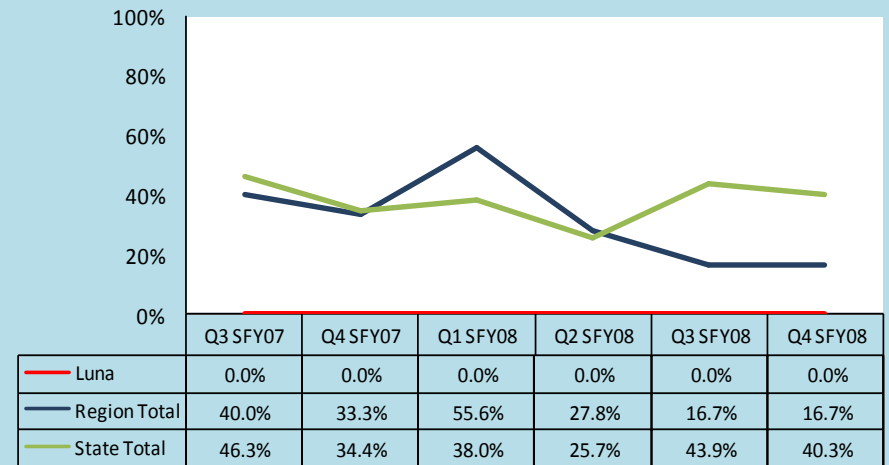
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of a Prior Episode

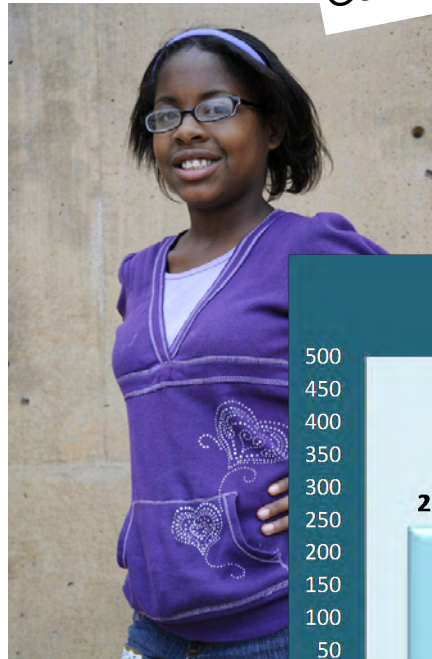

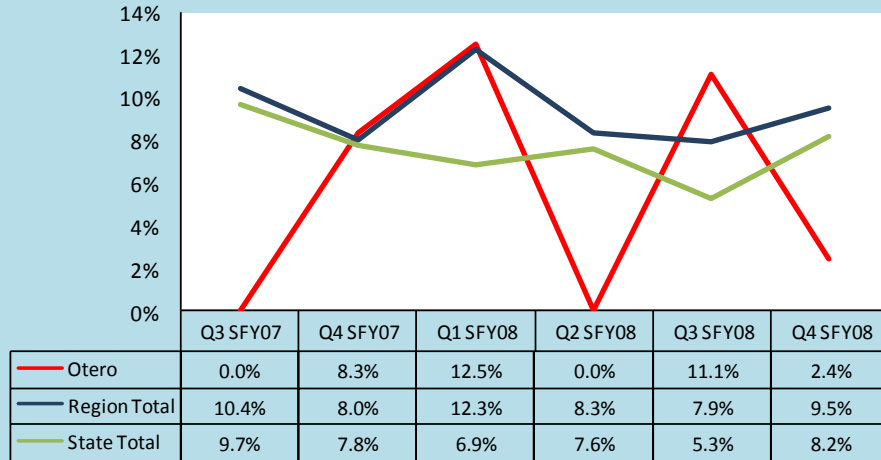

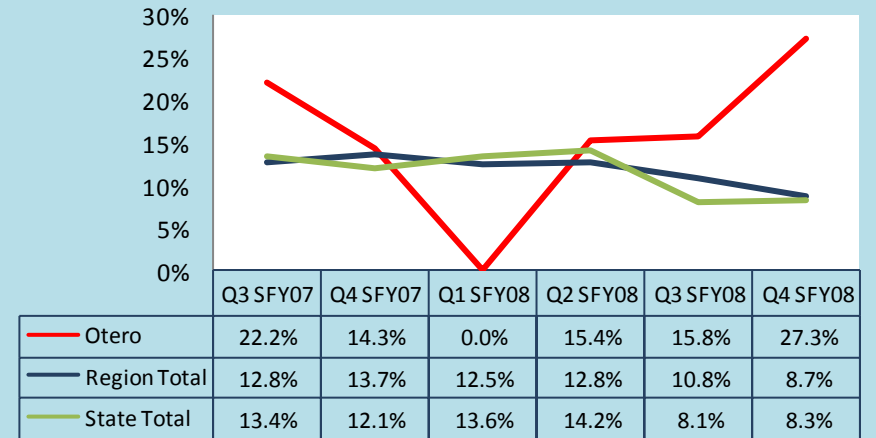

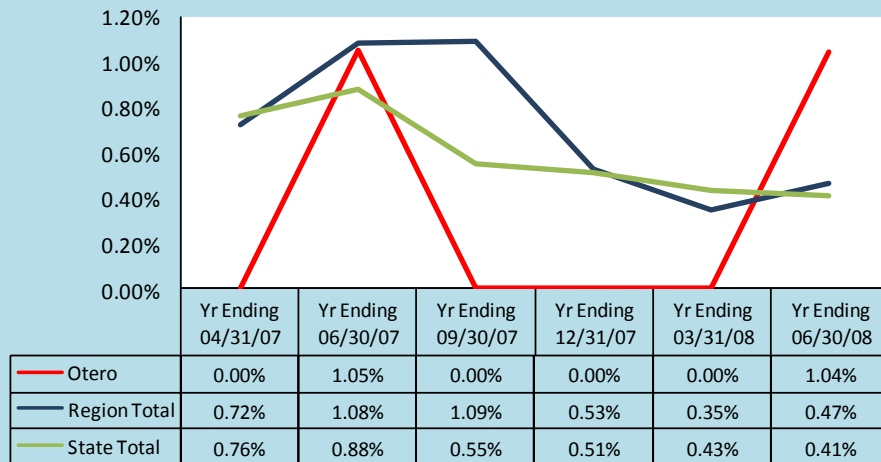
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

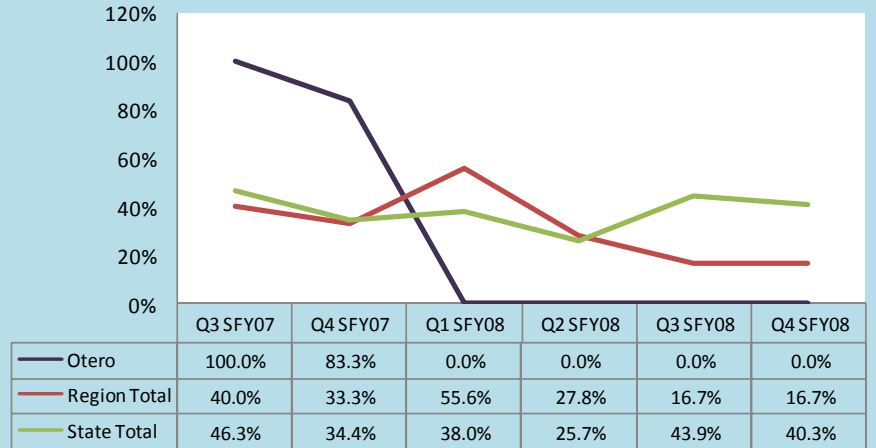
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of A Prior Episode

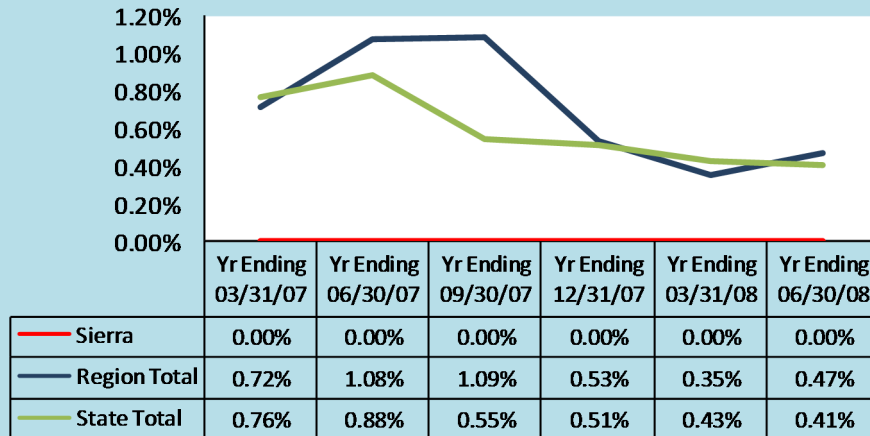
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

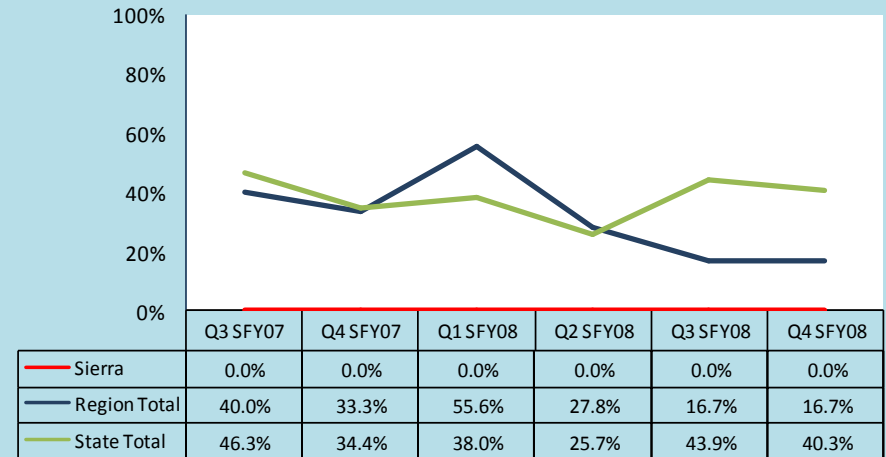
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of a Prior Episode

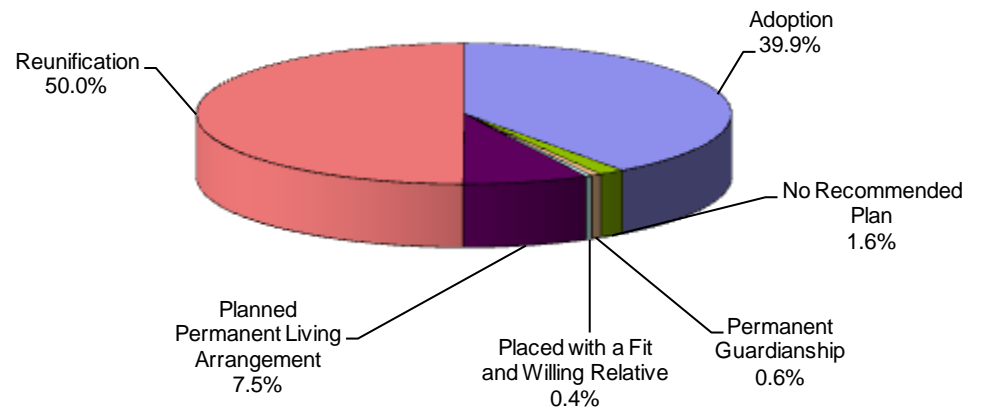

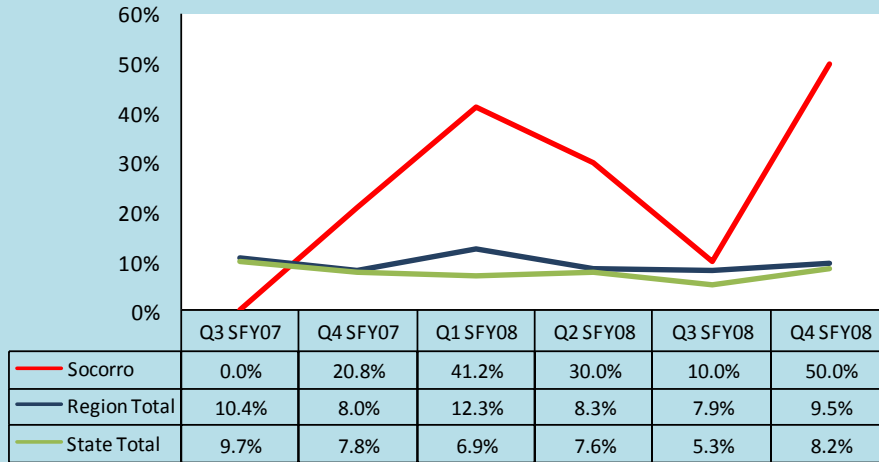

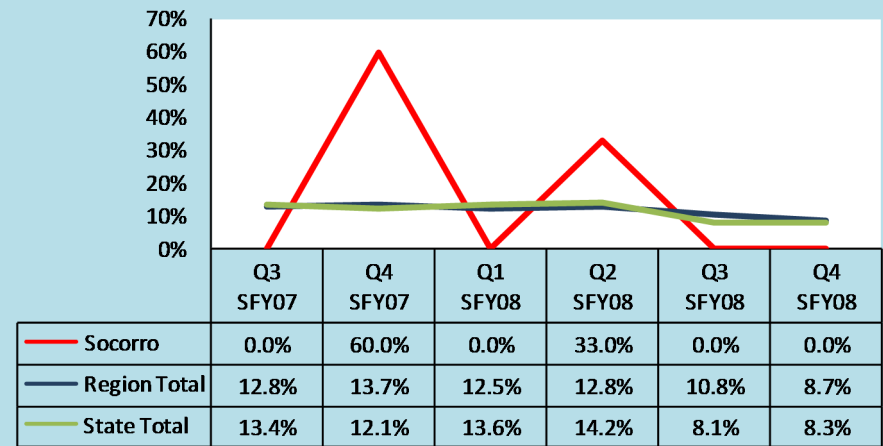

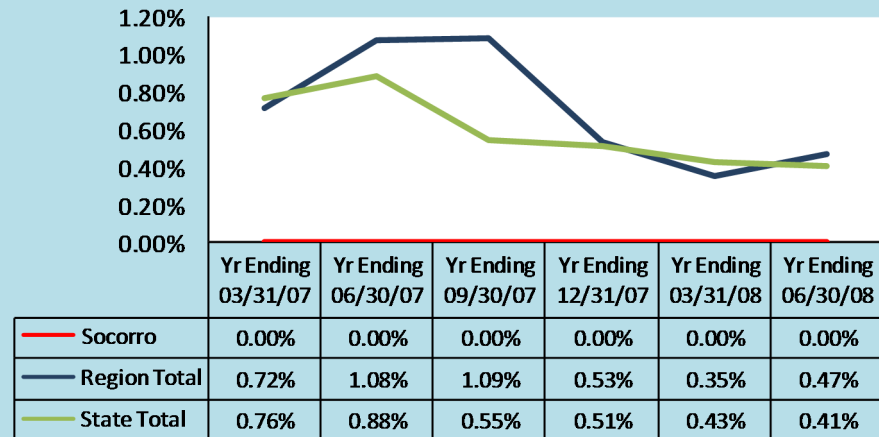
Trends of Recurrence of Substantiated Maltreatment Within 6 Months of a Previously Substantiated Report of Maltreatment

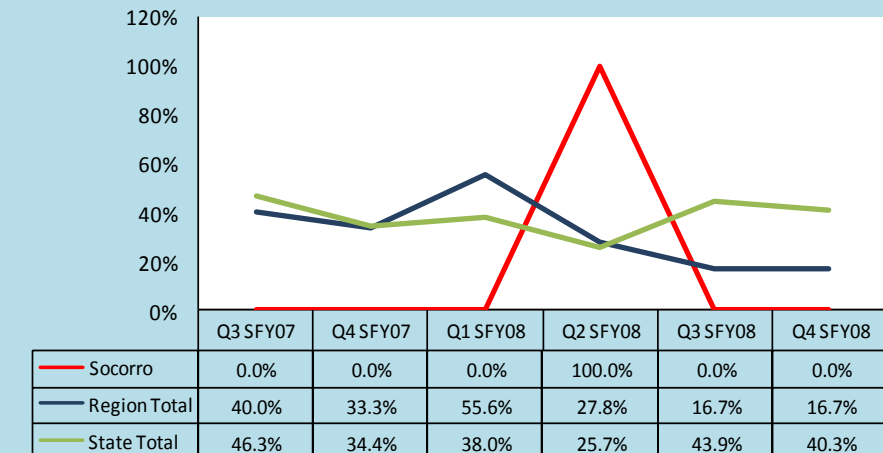
Trends of Children Reentering Care within Twelve Months of A Prior Episode

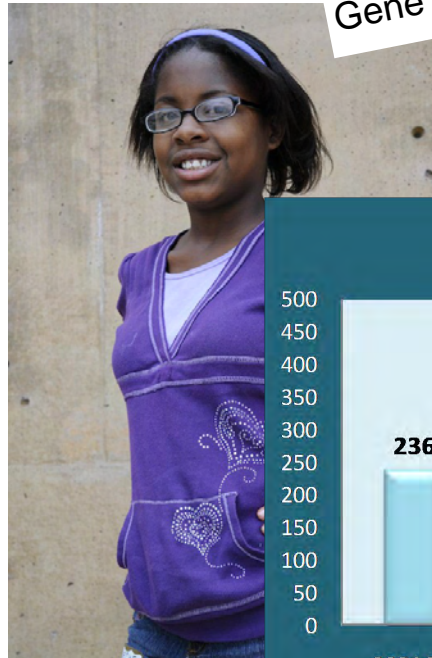

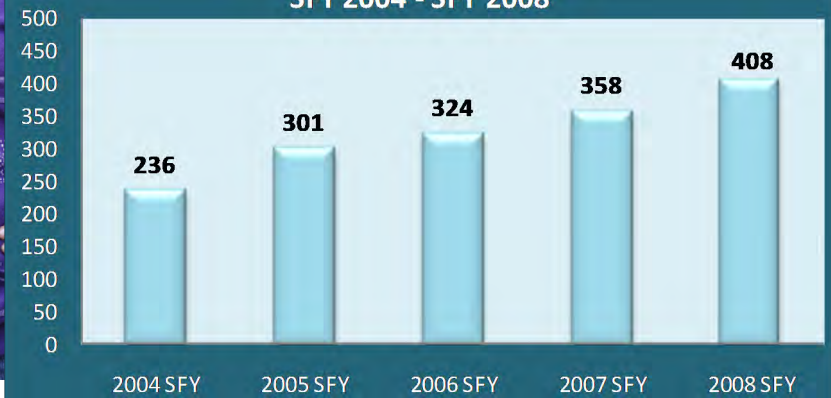
